Good afternoon and welcome back to the SEAH Stadium for today's league game against Stoke City.

I wanted to start by mentioning the recent sad and shocking news about Matt Beard who was only here back in August managing his Burnley side. When something like that happens it certainly puts life into perspective and reminds us that we never know what people have got going on in the background. Matt was a great character and a real trailblazer in the women's game and our thoughts are with his family and friends and everyone who came into contact with him during his impressive career.

Today's game comes off the back of two 7-1 away wins - in the league and cup. The league win against Hull was the performance we'd been waiting for. It was an excellent collective team effort with a standout performance from Katie Johnson. I was delighted with the goals coming from all over the pitch and for Abi Loydon getting her first league goal of the season.

Last week we made plenty of changes for the League Cup game against Wythenshawe with Anna Grey and Chloe Williams both doing well as they return from injury. I was delighted to see Chloe get her first goal in her second stint at the club as well as goals for Charlotte and Quiggs - and of course Amber with her 99th Wolves goal. It's an amazing goalscoring record - to be on 99 goals in only 112 games is ridiculous. I did ask her to save her 100th goal for today's game!

It was also a proud moment to see Connie Matthews make her senior debut, someone else like Sareet who I remember as an eight-year-old. Her first contact was excellent, she was aggressive when she needed to be and composed herself in the right moments. She certainly didn't look out of place, so I'm delighted for her. I'm keen that we keep giving opportunities to the youngsters who deserve it and Connie certainly did.

Although I thought we lacked quality in some parts of that game, it was still a good win, making it three wins out of three in the group stages of the competition. That takes us through to the knock-out stage where we've drawn Sporting Khalsa away.

So we now have two tough league games, starting with today's game against Stoke. Obviously we played them here in the League Cup in the opening game of the season when we won 2-1 with a last-minute goal from Amber.

We were really good in the first half of that game, and I felt we probably could have put the game to bed then, but Stoke certainly made it difficult for us after that. A lot has happened since then. Both teams have had time to gel now, so we'll be seeing two different sets of players. It's important we approach the game with confidence - the same as next week at Albion in the first Black Country derby of the season.

Thanks to all our fans for the ongoing support, both here and at the away games. Be loud and proud.

# AMBER HUGHES

## FIRST THING

An away game is a case of getting up, getting ready and getting to Compton as it's an early start, but on home matchdays we obviously have a bit more time. Before a game at Telford, we'd get in for breakfast, but I always eat at home first anyway. I do try and chill as much as I can in the morning, because we don't meet until 11 and I'll be up from about or awake from 8, so I do try to have a bit of a chilled morning, whether it's just watching telly or having some food, before I head over to Telford.

## MATCHDAY ROUTINE

I try to treat every matchday the same – nice and chilled. When you work in the week as well, a matchday is almost like one of the mornings you get where you can just chill a bit. I am thinking about the game, but I do try to use it as a bit of a morning where it's my own time and I can just relax. Whether that's watching the telly or popping out for a walk, but generally it's just wake up and chill.

## FOOD AND DRINK

I always have eggs on toast with beans, with a cup of tea. I generally have the same food for breakfast, regardless of whether we're playing at home or away, and if we're having to leave earlier, then I'll wake up earlier and have that before I go.

## TALKING A GOOD GAME

I always talk to my family. They'll all text me and wish me good luck, because they all know who I'm playing and what's going on. Then on the way to the game, I'll speak to a couple of friends or I'll have spoken to them the night before, just about the game and things like that. But there's no-one specific that I have to speak to.

## ON THE HEADPHONES

I like old school, classic party bangers. Sometimes I will just put a Spotify playlist on and just listen to ones that you can just have a good bop along to which will get me in the mood. The drive there, that's when I've got some time, and I do use it as a time to listen to music, as opposed to thinking too much about the game, because if I start thinking about it, then I'll just start fretting. I do try and almost zone out of it at that point and just focus elsewhere.

## BUS BUDDIES

Generally, I sit with Robbo and Bec Thomas. I wouldn't say we're superstitious, but we always sit at the table on the left-hand side, at the front, so we are a bit anal with that. But then we'll have Beth Merrick, Becks [Anderson] and Char [Greengrass] will sit alongside us. We'll always have Match of the Day on the telly, and you'll find out who are the ones who stayed up for it on the Saturday night, those who watched it and those who fell asleep, so that's quite a nice thing because everyone is chatting about that and about the games at the weekend. Then we'll just chat, sometimes we play card games with the staff, but generally we just talk about rubbish and we have enough to get us through three hours.

## AT THE GROUND

I'll always kind of try and sort out my space. I want to make sure I've got what I need, and I've got my drinks and stuff sorted. I do like going and having a look at the pitch, even though we've been to most of them, it's quite nice to get out there and think about the games that we've had there before and times where it's gone well.

## GAME MODE

As soon as I start getting ready, that's it. We will all chat and talk about loads of things, but once you're in the changing room and everyone starts getting ready and everyone starts putting the kit on, then it's a case of, it's down to business time.

## POST-MATCH PLANS

I usually have some bad food! I've been told that's the best time to have it, so I'm just going off good advice. I'll always speak to my family afterwards because they'll always want to know how I've got on and then I just like to chill on the sofa when I get back. I'll always have a nice cup of tea if we get back early, but then it's just a case of chilling. I'll speak to the girls, regardless of how the game's gone, I'll speak to the girls throughout the evening, and sometimes we'll go out for food or drink after the game. But it's nice to do that either way, but it's always an evening to just chill and relax.

## SWITCHING OFF

If it's a loss, it's very hard to switch off and it does affect the rest of the evening and into Monday mornings. I do find it difficult, but I don't think it's a bad thing. For me, if you can walk away from a game and you don't care at all, then I think you're not really in it. I'd rather care and have that emotional attachment to it. While it's also good to speak to people about different things to kind of distract myself from the result.







## Stoke City Women

Stoke City's women's team was inaugurated in the summer of 2001, and they've been climbing the leagues ever since.

The inaugural season in the West Midlands League Division One ended in success as the Potters finished third in the table and gained promotion via the play-offs.

From there, the team consolidated their position in the West Midlands Premier Division and began entering into the Staffordshire County Ladies Challenge Cup.

A first Challenge Cup final was reached in 2007, which they won, and they have now lifted the trophy 16 times, with the most recent success in the 2025 final.

Promotion to the Midlands Women's Combination League was secured in 2009 as the team finished as champions,

whilst a historic treble was earned in 2013 as the team scooped the league championship, League Cup and County Cup.

That title saw the team promoted to the FA Women's National League North where they continue to play to this day.

The Potters reached the final of the FA Women's National League Cup in 2020, however, due to the COVID-19 pandemic the final never took place.

In 2023, the team developed to semi-professional status, following significant investment from the Club's ownership.

The owners' financial commitment aims to bring success to the women's team but, more importantly, encourage young girls in Stoke-on-Trent and Staffordshire to participate in the sport.

Meanwhile, the Potters' form continued in cup competitions with their run to the Adobe Women's FA Cup Fourth Round, their best in five years, while defeats of Wolves, Barnsley, Liverpool Feds, Burnley and Plymouth Argyle booked their spot in the FA Women's National League Cup for only the second time in the club's history.

Following the conclusion of the 2024/25 campaign, the club appointed Sarah Richardson as the new Head Coach of their women's first team, while also announcing long-term plans to put local talent at the heart of its strategy for women's and girls' football through a new Elite Girls' Academy programme.

# FA Women's National League Cup 2025/26 UPDATE

**Wolves' 7-1 victory away at Wythenshawe last Sunday made it a clean sweep of three wins from three in the group stage of the FA WNL Cup.**

Wolves topped Group Q, meaning they now join 31 other teams in the League Cup knockout phase, made up of the winners of each group and the 10 best performing runners up.

Wolves have been drawn away to Sporting Khalsa with the date due to be announced in due course.

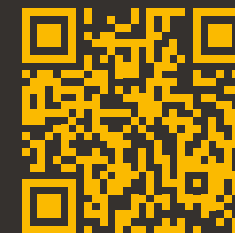

### Meetings, structure & commitment

- The club will aim to meet with the focus group as and when relevant topics arise, but at least twice a season. Meetings will be held either at Molineux or virtually by teams.
- Members will also be part of messaging or discussion groups with relevant club officials, to ensure ongoing dialogue, feedback loops, and input into decisions.
- A representative from the Fan Focus Group will be selected to liaise directly with club management and assist in setting agendas.
- Membership will include a regular review, with rotation of a percentage of participants each season to allow fresh perspectives.
- Relevant members of club staff, including senior figures, will attend group meetings based on each meeting's agenda.

# IN OTHER NEWS...

## 300 Up [1]

Congratulations to Jade Cross who became the latest inductee into the Wolves 300 Club when she played in the League Cup game against Manchester United Professional Game Academy on 7th September. She joins Anne Johnson, Amber Quick and Anna Price who have all reached the incredible milestone and join the male players taking pride of place on the '300 Club' board in the reception area at Molineux.

Born and bred in Wolverhampton, the prolific forward has been part of the pack since the age of nine and has dedicated her footballing life to the club as she shines week in and week out, with her blistering pace being a skill many fans have admired over the years.

Cross joined the club alongside her twin sister Emma, who made more than 250 appearances in defence before retiring in the summer of 2025, and both have experienced ups and downs with their beloved club.

Balancing her footballing career with being a chartered accountant, Cross achieved a well-deserved promotion with the club at the end of the 2020/21 season, before her goals helped fire the team to the FA Women's National League Northern Premier Division title the following year.

A veteran in the Wolves dressing room, Cross scored her 150th senior goal in a 3-0 victory over West Bromwich Albion in the Black Country derby back in January 2022.

She has been able to use her pace to get up and down the pitch as she transitioned into a winger and a wing-back, following the arrival of Amber Hughes and Charlotte Greengrass in recent years, but her striking instincts have not left, as she still regularly finds the net for Dan McNamara's side.

## 99 goals...

Last Sunday saw star striker Amber Hughes notch up her 99th goal for the club in all competitions when she scored the final of Wolves' seven goals in their 7-1 League Cup victory over Wythenshawe. Could she score her 100th goal today?
