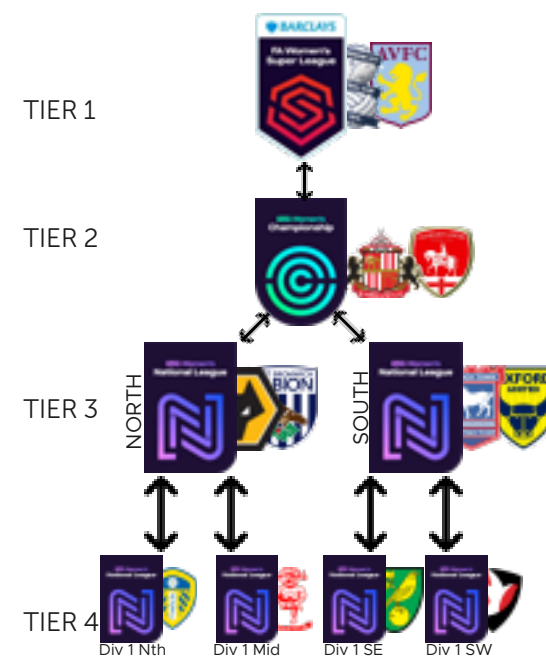

Good afternoon everyone,


I wanted to start my notes today by congratulating Macca, his players and staff on their start to the season. The reserves group see first-hand the level that they operate at so although its no surprise to us, it's nice to see they are getting early rewards for their efforts.

THE PACK PROFILES

TAMMI GEORGE

Tammi George joined the Wolves family in her early teens and worked her way through the junior teams to become a driving force in the midfield of the first team.

She joined the first team squad in the summer of 2017, making her debut two days before her 17th birthday in a League Plate defeat at home to Long Eaton United. Tammi featured for the full 120 minutes as the game went to extra-time before Long Eaton progressed to the next round.

She had to wait a further two months before her next appearance, but then missed only one of the final nine league fixtures.

Tammi started the opening game of the 2018/19 season but suffered an early injury which kept her out for five weeks before her return. She was then a near constant member of the team for the remainder of the season, missing only four further fixtures. Her first goal in the old gold came in late September when she scored a hat-trick in the 11-0 league win over Steel City Wanderers. Overall she bagged seven goals in 18 appearances.

Tammi's performances attracted the attention of suitors from teams at a higher level and in the summer of 2019 she signed for Women's Super League side Tottenham Hotspur. Featuring in their Under 23s development team, she was training four times a week, and in her debut notched a hat-trick in a 7-0 win over Norwich City. She also had the opportunity to train with the first team, which certainly helped her game to develop.

Still living and working in the Midlands, travelling up and down the motorways eventually took its toll and Tammi decided to move to a team closer to home, choosing Stoke City. Having signed for The Potters in late January she managed four games and two goals before the season was ended by the Covid pandemic.

The summer of 2020 saw her return to Wolves where she smoothly slotted into the central midfield berth she previously patrolled. Featuring from the start in every game, she was a vital cog as Wolves recorded six comprehensive league wins before the season was ended, and helped the team through to the fourth round of the Women's FA Cup.

This summer she has continued to boss the midfield, this time alongside Summer Holmes, as Wolves have adapted well to the National Division. Her only goal of this campaign was the opener in the Black County Derby against West Bromwich Albion.

HULL CITY LADIES HISTORY

Formed as recently as 2001, Hull City Ladies commenced competitive life in the Yorkshire & Humberside League. It didn't take the Tigresses long to find their feet and the Summer of 2005 saw them promoted to the North East Women's Premier League.

Not content with that success, they forged on, and after a couple of years were again promoted, this time to the Northern Combination. Their swift rise through the leagues was temporarily halted, and after only two seasons they dropped back down a level where they consolidated and began to build.

The 2011/12 season saw an influx of new players as the club merged with Beverley Town, a venture which brought an almost instant return with the team finishing runners-up, some five points behind Sheffield United Community Ladies. Finishing third the following season, they again challenged for the honours in 2013/14 when a frustrating draw in their final game of the season saw them miss out on the championship by a single point to Norton & Stockton Ancients.

Following that disappointment they finally managed to grab the silverware in 2014/15, and with it promotion to the FA Women's Premier League Division One North.

They were quick to adapt to football at Tier 4 and an excellent season saw them get off to a tremendous start, losing only one of their first 10 games and, despite a poor end to the term, they finished fourth.

2016/17 saw them improve to third, although a poor finish to the season again left them disappointed. 2017/18, however, was a season of triumph for Hull City. This time they performed throughout the season and at its conclusion captured the league title as well as advancing through to the semi-final of the League Plate where they lost to West Ham United, a team destined for the Super League.

Now at unprecedented heights in the Women's pyramid, that first season in the Northern Division was a struggle at times, but at its conclusion they finished five points above the relegation zone, retaining their status in the third tier.

The last two seasons have been Covid-hit as we know, but they have also been poor for the Tigresses. From 21 games they have won only three and, had the seasons not been cancelled, they may have been in relegation trouble. This season hasn't been a good one for them to date, with only a single point from their five games.

Today's game will be their first meeting with Wolves Women.

OFF THE PITCH

Making a living

I'm a prison officer and it's a really enjoyable job. It's tough with football because I work shifts, which can be anything from early shifts, full-day shifts, late shifts and night shifts. I work on a weekend-on, weekend-off basis so do rely on a lot of colleagues swapping shifts on a Sunday to enable me to play, or I use quite a bit of my annual leave.

Balancing work and football

It's difficult and it is probably the biggest challenge for me personally, in making sure I complete all my shifts but also making training two or three times a week and having every Sunday off. That's definitely a challenge, and even the time I do have off, I'm spending it at football, so it's very rare that I have a day where I can rest up and relax. But I make it possible and wouldn't do it if I didn't enjoy both.

Football conversations at work

My colleagues are really supportive and there's plenty who are the same rank as me who come to games and cheer us on. At the West Brom game, there were quite a few down and they had a big banner made for me. I've been put in the weekly staff bulletins a couple of times, congratulating us on our promotion, so they're very supportive.

Hobbies and downtime

It's very limited time, so if I do have the odd day off, we just try to spend it with my friends and family, whether that's going for meals or days out with my niece and nephew as they like having sleepovers and days out.

Being a female footballer

It has changed season on season, but now it's becoming more obvious that there's a lot of girls out there who do look up to the women's players within the club. I've noticed quite a lot lately with the girls' dads going to the men's games, seeing the women's games promoted and they're bringing their girls along and it's the dads saying how inspiring that is and that the girls really want to get involved and they love coming down. It means a lot to me to see the young girls coming to the games and how inspired they are.

ON THE PITCH

Journey to Wolves

I was six years old when I started playing because I was mates with the lads and they were playing for a local club. I went round one of my mates' for tea and they were training, so I went along and have played ever since. I played for

Aston Villa when I was about eight and when I was older, I spent five or six years at West Brom, I was at Nottingham Forest for two years and then before I came to Wolves, I did a very, very short stint at Derby County.

Joining the club

When I was at Forest, I played with the likes of Bec Thomas, Summer Holmes, Amy Dicken and when we left Forest, they came straight to Wolves and I went to Derby. It didn't quite work out for me there, but I was still in conversations with those girls, who were telling me to come to Wolves. I spoke to Macca [Dan McNamara] and came to training at the end of the first season that was null and void, and from the minute I went, I knew I was going to sign.

Biggest influence

I will always be thankful for the coach I had when I was at the boys' team, Joe Hemmings, and

he really believed in me. When I was playing with the boys, there was a lot of stigma and a lot of stick coming my way being the only girl and he really drove me on and pushed for me to get into a girls' team. Then, in the female game, I'll have to say Graham Abercrombie, my coach at both Forest and West Brom; he played a big part, made me captain and believed in me. I know I've only been with Macca a short amount of time, but he's also showed me that belief only two people before in my career have done and made me fall in love with football again.

Being a Wolves player

Right now, the togetherness is the best thing, especially with everything we've been through with Covid. Not just the staff and players within the women's team, but also the togetherness across the whole club as we feel like one big team and that really plays a big part in the success we're currently having.

Hopes for the future

When I came in, the big aim from Macca was to get to tier three, which is what we've achieved. Getting promoted was always the aim, but this season, it's staying in the league. We're well on track to do that, but the main goal for me is to be in full-time football with the club, and that's the way we're heading.

Wolves Women are into the next round of the FAWNL Cup following their victory over Leeds United on Sunday afternoon at the CKW Stadium.

The hosts started quick on the attack from kick off with Leo Joyce coming close twice but was denied by the Leeds goalkeeper Lauren Joyce.

Third time was the charm when Joyce cut into the penalty area and fired a shot that this time went straight past the keeper to put Wolves ahead within 15 minutes. Just moments later, Kate Evans fired a shot at goal that just went wide.

The visitors looked to find their equaliser when Kathryn Smith drilled in a ball for Laura Bartup. However, she was denied by the woodwork.

Joyce again put the Leeds 'keeper to the test with a low shot at goal that the keeper couldn't quite hold on to. All she could do was parry it into path of Kate Evans who looked to capitalise, but her shot was blocked.

Leeds came close to levelling five minutes before the break with Bartup having a go at goal again with a flick that Becky Thomas did well to stop. It was then Wolves who got the second of the game when Anna Price leapt high to meet the ball in the air and headed home from a free kick.

Much like the start of the game, the second half saw Wolves straight on the attack again when Anna Morphet looked to threaten the Leeds goal but her shot went narrowly over.

Leeds got a goal back through Bartup rose high in the air to header the ball in from an Olivia Smart corner. The visitors had found a way back into the game, but Wolves were still holding the lead.

Wolves nearly regained their two-goal cushion on the hour mark. Amber Hughes embarked on a fine solo run, but her shot hit the inside of the post and somehow stayed out.

Ellie Butler came off the bench for her debut and was hoping to notch her first goal for her new side. However, she fired agonisingly wide.
