We hope you enjoy the game and thank you for your continued support.

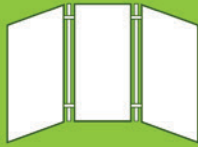

HULL CITY LADIES HISTORY

Today is only the second meeting between Hull City Ladies and Wolves Women in Hull's short history and comes just four weeks after the two sides faced each other in a league game at Compton Park when Wolves ran out 3-2 winners after a hard-fought battle.

Hull commenced competitive life in 2001 in the Yorkshire & Humberside League. It didn't take them long to find their feet and the summer of 2005 saw them promoted to the North East Women's Premier League.

Not content with that success, they forged on, and after a couple of years were again promoted, this time to the Northern Combination. Their swift rise through the leagues was temporarily halted, and after only two seasons they dropped back down a level where they consolidated and began to build.

The 2011/12 season saw an influx of new players as the club merged with Beverley Town, a venture which brought an almost instant return with the team finishing runners-up, some five points behind Sheffield United Community Ladies. Finishing third the following season, they again challenged for the honours in 2013/14 when a frustrating draw in their final game of the season saw them miss out on the championship by a single point to Norton & Stockton Ancients.

Following that disappointment, they finally managed to grab the silverware in 2014/15, and with it promotion to the FA Women's Premier

League Division One North. They were quick to adapt to football at Tier 4 and an excellent season saw them get off to a tremendous start, losing only one of their first 10 games and, despite a poor end to the term, they finished fourth.

2016/17 saw them improve to third, although a poor finish to the season again left them disappointed. 2017/18, however, was a season of triumph for Hull City. This time they performed throughout the season and at its conclusion captured the league title as well as advancing through to the semi-final of the League Plate where they lost to West Ham United, a team destined for the Super League.

Now at unprecedented heights in the Women's pyramid, that first season in the Northern Division was a struggle at times, but at its conclusion they finished five points above the relegation zone, retaining their status in the third tier.

The last two seasons have been Covid-hit as we know, but they have also been poor for the Tigresses. From 21 games they have won only three and, had the seasons not been cancelled, they may have been in relegation trouble.

This season has been a disappointing one so far for Hull. Yet to grab a league victory, they current sit bottom of the table, but the performance they put up at Compton Park four weeks ago shows they have talent. Surely it is only a matter of time before they start to earn points.

SUMMER HOLMES

MIDFIELDER

Currently patrolling the centre of Wolves' midfield alongside Tammi George, Summer Holmes may have made only a little over two dozen first team appearances in the old gold and black, but her career has been much more than that.

Summer made her way through the youth ranks at Wolves and into the first team picture in the latter part of 2011. Her first team debut came in December of that year as a 16-year-old substitute in the WFA Cup defeat to Loughborough Students. She also featured later in the season against Coventry City in the County Cup, again as a substitute.

The majority of the 2012/13 season was spent gaining playing time with the reserves although she did make her full first team debut in the County Cup tie at Lye.

The following season she established herself as a first team player, featuring nine times in the first half of what was a difficult campaign.

In December 2012 she made the switch across the Black Country to Sporting Club Albion where she played alongside current Wolves team-mates Becky Thomas and Kelly Darby. Featuring eight times in the remainder of the season she notched up four goals, two in her debut game against Lye Town in another County Cup fixture. She also played against Wolves in a 2-0 win.

The following season Summer was a constant in the Albion midfield as they established themselves in the Northern Division.

She was part of the title-winning team in 2015/16, but they lost in the play-off final to Brighton & Hove Albion.

The following season she featured nine times, taking her to a total of over 70 appearances in the blue and white stripes.

In the summer of 2017 Summer moved to Nottingham Forest, instantly establishing herself and featuring against both Wolves and Albion in consecutive weeks in October.

The following season saw her struck down with injury and it was only late in the season when she tried to return to action. She only managed a couple of appearances for Forest and one at Long Eaton United as she looked for fitness, but it wasn't to be.

That injury took Summer out of the game for almost a year and a half until the 2019/20 season saw her move back to where it all began at Wolves. She finally returned to action in October that year, featuring three times during the Covid-hit campaign. Last season she became a regular, featuring half a dozen times in the few games played.

This season she has established herself in the engine room at Wolves, and although she is yet to find the net in an old gold shirt, she has been a major part of the current unbeaten run.
