STOKE CITY WOMEN HISTORY



The club was formed in 2001 as Stoke City Ladies and began playing in the West Midlands League Division One North, in what was at that time the sixth tier of women's football in England. They finished in third position in that first season, some 10 points behind champions Crewe Vagrants, but did gain promotion to the Premier Division where they spent the next seven seasons.

They regularly finished in a top half position, but never quite managed to mount a title challenge. That was before the 2008/09 season when they almost defeated everything that was put in front of them. Collecting 81 points throughout the campaign, they finished a massive 35 points clear of runners-up Solihull to capture the Premier League title for the first time, and with it promotion to the Midland Combination League.

They handled the step up in class well and finished in a creditable mid-table position that first season, also winning the Staffordshire County Cup for the fourth time. They improved to a fourth-place finish in 2010/11 before mounting a serious title challenge the following term. They battled throughout the season with Wolverhampton Wanderers but eventually had to settle for runners-up spot, a couple of points behind the champions. They also suffered heartache in the League Cup competition as they lost in the final.

Unperturbed, they continued their fine form in the 2012/13 campaign and this time they triumphed. Dropping only five points all season, they raced to the title with five games remaining and completed the double when beating Leafeld Athletic 8-4 in an incredible League Cup Final.

Their title success saw The Potters move into the FA Women's Premier League and in March 2013 the club applied to join the expanding FA Women's Super League, but they were one of the unsuccessful applicants.

That first season in what is now the third tier of Women's Football was a good one for Stoke. They finished in mid-table, just four points behind the runners-up, although they were a distant 20 points behind champions Sheffield FC Ladies.

Since that first season in the National League they have finished no lower than seventh, with four consecutive fourth-place finishes from 2015/16 onwards. Prior to the pandemic they had won the Staffordshire Senior Cup 11 times in a row and will be aiming for another win next Sunday when they meet Sporting Khalsa in the semi-final of this year's competition.

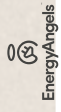

AMY DICKEN

STRIKER

Now in her third season in the old gold and black, Amy Dicken has yet to establish a regular slot in Dan McNamara's team, however, she is a vital member of the first team squad. Your proverbial box to box midfielder, she is a vital cog as Wolves look to close out games.

Her career began at local rivals Sporting Club Albion (now West Bromwich Albion) in 2014 as a 17-year-old. Her first team debut came as a late substitute at home to Stoke where she joined future Wolves players Summer Holmes, Kelly Darby and Bec Thomas on the field. Overall she featured three times that season.

The following term she was an ever-present in the team in what was a poor season for Albion, however, the 2015/16 campaign saw Albion capture the Northern Division title, Amy again a regular in the team as she netted her first goals, both in the County Cup. Unfortunately for Amy and West Brom they lost the play-off and missed out on promotion.

Amy remained at Albion for a further season before moving from West to East Midlands in the summer of 2017 as she joined Nottingham Forest. Again she stepped straight into the first team and was a regular in her two seasons there, netting against her former team in a 1-1 draw in January 2018.

She joined Wolves prior to the 2019/20 season, making a goalscoring debut in the WFA Cup as Wanderers eased past Shifnal Town 10-0, Dicken grabbing a second-half brace only seven minutes after coming on as a substitute.

Her first start in the old gold came in the County Cup at Leamington where she scored her first hat-trick as Wolves eased into the next round. Appearing mostly from the bench, she eventually featured in seven games, scoring an excellent six goals before the season was bought to a premature end.

Last season she featured only from the bench in what was again a curtailed campaign, however, she did play in the WFA Cup game against her former team Nottingham Forest where she netted from the spot in the penalty shoot-out. At the season's conclusion she played her part in Wolves lifting the Pygott and Crone Cup.
