# HUDDERSFIELD TOWN WOMEN HISTORY

The club was originally founded as Huddersfield Ladies FC in the summer of 1988, joining the North-East Regional League Division 2 where, in that first season, they won the League and Cup double.

Over the next few seasons the team developed well and by the end of the 1992/93 season they merged with Huddersfield Town Juniors to become Huddersfield Town Ladies. The immediate benefit was that the new club boasted two competitive teams at open age level as well as Under 16s, Under 14s and Under 12s.

The 1993/94 season saw the first team carry all before them, losing only once all season and winning the League Championship, the League Cup, Yorkshire Cup, Arco 7-a-side Cup, the Regional 5-a-side Trophy and at Woking they were crowned National 5-a-side Champions. The following season saw them retain the League Championship, winning all 16 league matches and scoring 101 goals in the process, conceding only 14. Although failing to retain the Knockout Cup, Town held on to the Yorkshire Cup, and made it to the Women's Premier League in 1995. Over the next few seasons, the team stood still and eventually took a backward step when relegated back to the Yorkshire & Humberside League, but they eventually rose into the Northern Women's Combination in 2010. From there it took them a further four years before they made it back to the national stage by gaining promotion to the Premier League in 2014, eight points clear of the runners-up. That summer wasn't all success as they lost the backing of the men's team and had to fend for themselves.

Since returning to the Premier League they have established themselves at this level, consistently finishing in and around the middle of the table. Last season was a typically good one for The Terriers as they were sitting at the top of the Northern Division table when the season was curtailed in late 2020 due to the Covid outbreak. They are currently in fifth place, 13 points behind leaders Wolves prior to today's fixture.

# BETH MERRICK

In some ways Beth Merrick's football career has completed a full circle, starting here at Wolves in the junior ranks, leaving for opportunities at a higher level and now back where it all began wearing the old gold and black as a valued member of the senior squad.

She joined Wolves Centre of Excellence at Under 7's level before jumping ship to the Villa Academy in her mid-teens where she progressed through the ranks and into the first team squad as a 17-year-old playing in the National League. In that 2012/13 campaign she featured 18 times, netting a couple of goals, her first in a 3-1 win away to Coventry City.

The summer of 2013 saw Aston Villa admitted to the expanded Women's Super League, but the players had to wait until February 2014 for their next competitive game as at that stage the top two tiers played during the summer. That first season at a higher level was a difficult one for Beth as Villa brought in several more experienced players which restricted her appearances. Despite that she still played 11 games, netting once.

In 2015 she featured in more games, notching up 21 appearances with six goals, whilst the following season she was an ever-present, managing her best goal haul of nine, including a brace in the last game of the season against Watford at Villa Park.

The 2017 term was the final season of summer football, and a reduced competition was played. Beth featured nine times, scoring just a single goal. It was back to the traditional wintertime football in 2017/18 for what was Beth's final season with Villa, where once again she was a permanent member of the team, missing just a single game. Overall, in the claret and blue she made 87 appearances with a grand total of 19 goals.

Beth commenced the 2018/19 season with Sheffield United, ironically her debut coming in a league victory over former club Villa. At the end of the year she moved back to the Midlands and Coventry United where she featured 18 times, notching up eight goals as Coventry captured the Southern Division title but lost to Blackburn in the end of season play-off. Despite that Coventry moved up to the Women's Championship.

Over the last two seasons Beth was a virtual ever-present with Coventry, generally featuring on the right side of midfield. In 38 games she netted five times, the highlight being her first senior hat-trick against Durham Women, tainted by the fact that Coventry lost 4-3! At the end of last term Coventry announced that they were to go full time, but with Beth being a teacher she didn't want to give up her occupation, which led to her returning to Wolves last July.

This term she slotted well into the Wolves first team and shown her quality. She has missed just a single game, when work commitments delayed her for the midweek game at Stoke, and she has started to find the net. She grabbed a hattrick against Bedworth United in the County Cup to kick start a scoring streak and netted her eighth of the season at Sheffield last Sunday.


