MATCH REPORT

Wolves 0 - 2 West Ham (Brynjarsdottir 70, Johnson OG 76) Vitality Women's FA Cup Fourth Round | Sunday 29th January 2023

Wolves Women continued to make history as they played their first game against WSL opposition in the fourth round of the Vitality Women's FA Cup.

Attendance records were smashed as 1.692 fans came to watch versus West Ham, doubling the previous attendance record held at the New Bucks Head for the old gold. The Hammers were able to leave with the victory in the end, but Wolves put in a performance to be proud of against their full-time counterparts, who sit two divisions above.

West Ham, managed by Paul Konchesky, held possession early on as both teams looked to find their feet. The Hammers' goal was to keep possession and overwhelm the old gold, but the home side had a plan as they looked dangerous on the counter-attack.

Beth Merrick caused real issues for the West Ham defence with her dribbling ability, with one run starting from her own defence as she drove with the ball into the away box before being eventually stopped by French international Hawa Cissoko.

West Ham's biggest threat came from Izzy Atkinson who created multiple chances for the Hammers in the first half, with her best opportunity coming when she forced a save from Shan Turner, leaving Lisa Evans with a possible rebound but it was put over the goal.

Wolves continued to hit West Ham on the break, but the away side were well organised and defended well

throughout the first half.

The old gold came out positive in the second half. catching their WSL foes on the break multiple times, with the closest attempt coming from Destiney Toussaint after she received a precise through ball from Maz Gauntlett. The West Ham defence continued to stay organised and were able to stop the home side from taking the lead.


A sensational passage of play then saw Turner make an incredible double stop while, at the other end, a ball from Toussaint found Helen Dermody who hit the back of the net. However, the flag was up to deny Wolves an opener, but it did show that Dan McNamara's side could cause real problems on the break, forcing a shift in West Ham's play.

And they were finally able to get their goal, as a back pass from Summer Holmes and quick attempt at a clearance from Turner led to the ball falling to substitute Dagny Brynjarsdottir, who calmly slotted it into the bottom-left corner of the goal to give the visitors the lead.

The Hammers continued to pile on the pressure and they doubled their advantage within five minutes, when an attempted clearance from Katie Johnson unfortunately found the back of her own net.

The crowd never left Wolves' side though, pushing the girls to continue battling, which they did for the full 90 minutes, making everybody in the New Bucks Head who were there to support the girls proud to be a Wolves fan that day.

THE INTERVIEW MAZ GAUNTLETT

When you need a screamer scoring, Maz Gauntlett is who to turn to.

From a screamer on her debut to a screamer in the County Cup final against the Baggies, Maz is always coming up with moments of magic in crucial games.

The Birmingham-born striker spent her early career at Blues before moving to Coventry for a decade and to the Old Gold in the summer of 2021 along with many of her Coventry turned Wolves teammates.

Despite having multiple ACL reconstructions, Gauntlett scored over 100 goals at Coventry, then scored eight in 12 appearances once returning from injury in February 2022 at Wolves in her first season and has contributed to our success thus far in the 2022/23 season.

This is your second season in old gold, how would you sum up your time here so far?

"Definitely enjoyable! It's been a good season and we've progressed so far. We were unlucky last year in terms of not getting the promotion because of the FA rules, but you can just see the difference in the professionalism every single year and the backing of the men's club and what they've given us. It's a great club to be at."

You came to the club while still recovering from an ACL reconstruction, what was it like joining but knowing you couldn't step out on the pitch straight away?

"I was very anxious at the time due to carrying the injury for so long and not being able to play and putting the trust in a club that you don't really know much about. I worked so closely with Tayls (physio Paul Taylor) to get me back fit. There were also these expectations because of where I'd came from, but when you're out for so long, you know that you're never going to be as good as you were before the injury, so it was nice to have the backing of the girls and the staff to still have the belief in me ready for when I was fit to play."

Was Macca's message clear to you when he brought you to the club as to what he wanted from you?

"Absolutely; what he wanted was standards to be set and there was one direction that the club wanted to go in and that was into the Championship and the WSL. He backed me all the way and always had the belief that once I was back playing, he believed that I would have a massive impact on the squad. His message was do the right things away from football and football will do the right things for you here."

You made your debut away against Hull and scored a screamer and since then the screamers keep on coming, but which one has been your favourite?

"The Baggies County Cup final goal was my favourite one. I wouldn't say it's my best goal, but it's my favourite goal purely because of the stick I was getting from all the fans for about 35/40 minutes and to be able to score was like 'talking with your feet, not talking with your mouth' and it was such a nice moment for me.

"My best goal would be the goal away against Forest this season, just because of the pressure of the game, what was at stake and I think we were peppering their goal and we just couldn't score. We knew that when one went in, that we'd be okay after that, so it was nice just to get off the mark."

Strikers play different roles at clubs; how would you describe your role as a striker and has it changed over the years?

"I wouldn't say it's changed over the years. My role as a striker is to bring other players into play. Which means holding up the ball and creating things in a deeper position to be able to get us higher up the pitch and let other strikers and myself and other players around the pitch get up with play and score the goals from where we need to be."

You've played alongside Amber Hughes at Coventry and here at Wolves, what's it like playing alongside someone who can always find the right positions and slot the ball home?

"Amber's a great player! You always know you can rely on her to dig you out of something, and obviously link-up play is very important, and I've obviously played with her for a long long time, so I think that's why the connection is there."

How much do you owe to Coventry for what they did for your career?

"I have massive amounts of respect for the club. I was at the club for 10 years; went through two ACL reconstructions while I was there, we won the league twice, won the County Cup many times and we obviously went into the Championship with the club. It's a proud moment for me in my career to be able to put on paper what I've achieved with the club. The backing of the staff there was great. It's had a massive impact on me and my career and where I am now."

You've played at Birmingham from a very young age, what was that experience like?

"At the time we were in the Northern Premier League before it all got restructured. My time at Blues, I would describe as people my age playing old-school football, where you can be dirty, you can have a go at players, and they set you up to allow you to have the standards of what you've got and the drive etc. Just the name Blues, even now it's had a massive impact on my career. I can't think of anyone at Wolves that I played with at Blues, but obviously Destiney was at Blues as well, so she'll tell you where the standards are as well within the club. It's a proud moment for me to be able to say I played for Blues."

It looks like you and Destiney have created a special friendship since she joined in the summer?

"I've played with Dest for a long, long time, playing at Coventry together and now here at Wolves.

"We've also had the same friendship circle. She's a bit of a joker and a great person to be around and a great person to have at the club."


What do you do for your day job?

"During the week I'm an IT consultant, so all things security within cyber-crime etc. It's tough, working 8.30-5.00, then going from work to training, getting back at 11.00/11.30 and then doing it again the next day. The demand at work is tough as well so it's just about balancing it."

Who have been your inspirations growing up?

"I have two. In the footballing world, Wayne Rooney was always who I wanted to be, especially because of his aggression, and then away from football my biggest inspiration is my mum. She's a great person and if I ever end up like anyone in life, I'd be happy if I end up like her."

TODAY'S OPPONENTS

HUDDERSFIELD TOWN IN THE LEAGUE CUP





Huddersfield are in their 15th season in the National League over two stints, the later definitely being more successful than the first. The Terriers' first period in the league spanned 1995 to 2001, a six-season period which saw them play eight games with only two victories secured. This was in the days when the competition was a straight knock-out with no League Plate competition as a fall back for those who lost in the initial round

Huddersfield returned to the Premier League in 2014 when the current Cup and Plate format was in place. That initial season saw them lose to Newcastle United in the determining round and so moving to the League Plate competition. Things went well with wins over Liverpool Marshall Feds, Chester-le-Street, Radcliffe Olympic and Shanklin which took them through to the final. There they met Preston North End with the tie in the balance right to the end, North End eventually triumphing 3-0 thanks to a couple of goals in the last ten minutes of the game.

The following term saw Huddersfield ease past Blackpool Wren Rovers in the determining round as they notched up 10 goals before losing to Blackburn Rovers. In 2016/17 they again failed in the determining round and dropped into the Plate

competition. 10 goals in the initial two rounds saw them ease past Sporting Khalsa and Guiseley Vixens before 7-0 and 6-1 wins over Tranmere Rovers and Actonians took them again through to the final. This time they met Southern Division Lewes and again suffered defeat 0-4. This was the last time they appeared in the Plate competition.

In two of the following three seasons, they made their way through to the guarter-final before the Covidenforced shutdown in 2020/21 saw the cancellation of the competition. Last season they again had a good run, starting off with a comprehensive win over Boldmere St Michaels in the determining round. They then defeated Middlesbrough and Loughborough Lightning to reach the guarter-final where a Laura Elford hat-trick helped them to a 4-1 win over Brighouse. A Katie Stanley strike just after half-time took them through to the final against Southampton where the Saints triumphed 3-0.

Three finals over the last eight seasons has been a good return for the Terriers which brings us to today's game where Huddersfield and Wolves meet for the first time in this competition with a slot in the semifinal the reward for the victors.
