BEC THOMAS

Wolves Women goalkeeper Bec Thomas is next to sit in the programme hot seat this season and answer a few quirky questions.

WHAT IS THE MOST MEMORABLE PLACE YOU'VE PLAYED FOOTBALL?

I'd probably say Man City's ground. It was when I played for Albion earlier in my career, in the fifth round of the FA Cup. We played against the likes of Steph Houghton and players like that, so a very good Man City team and it was a great memory to have. I was a lot younger than I am now, so it was amazing at the time and a real good experience to see them go as far as they did, to say that you have played against them.

WHAT ARE THE STRANGEST SUPERSTITIONS YOU'VE SEEN FROM TEAMMATES?

I think a few of the girls have already said some of the main ones from our dressing room, like Tammi who literally has to go to the toilet at the very last minute! I have a few superstitions of my own – it's not a strange one, but I always have to touch the crossbar at the start of the first half and the second half. Before we kick off, I jump up, hit the crossbar, and then I'm ready to go. I don't know why, but it's always something I've done.

WHAT IS THE GREATEST COMEBACK YOU'VE BEEN INVOLVED IN?

It has to be the Forest game last season – there's no other answer. We'll never forget it. One of our strengths is our determination and never give up attitude. If we ever fall behind, I always have that confidence that we can fight back because we will never give up. We've proved that over numerous amounts of times, but obviously that one against Forest will always stick out.

WHICH OF YOUR WOLVES TEAMMATES HAS THE WORST TASTE IN MUSIC?

I only ever hear everyone listening to the playlist in the changing rooms, to be fair. I think we've all got quite similar taste, because I thought I'd be pulled up on being a Celine Dion fan, but there seems to be quite a few of us in the squad who like her. I don't feel bad singing along to her, and a power ballad always gets me going. But I think everyone is quite similar really.

WHAT IS THE STRANGEST MOMENT YOU'VE EXPERIENCED IN A GAME?

Being a goalkeeper, there's some weird things that happen to you, but most of the time they're just things that can happen in football. One of the strangest things was when I scored from my own box, but that was when I was about 21 at college. I was taking a kick out of my hands, I hit it pretty well and the wind took it, it bounced and went over the keeper. We were 1-0 up at half time because of it, and I just didn't know how to react, I didn't celebrate or anything. It's not like you can go running up the pitch to celebrate when you're a goalkeeper, so I just turned around and went back in goal.

WHO IS THE BIGGEST CHARACTER IN A DRESSING ROOM YOU'VE BEEN IN?

I know her name has come up already this season, but Sophie Bramford who used to play for us is a character in a funny way. The best way I can describe her is that she's just different. She has a unique personality and she's funny without even trying to be. I don't think she realises that she's that funny, and I don't think she means to be, but that's just how she is. You can't forget her.

WHAT IS THE ODDEST THING YOU'VE HEARD SAID DURING A MATCH?

Because of being in goal, I don't actually hear that much. I feel I'm very much out of the way, unless things are happening in and around me. But when we played Hull the other week, a girl went in towards me two-footed, quite near my face, but luckily she didn't catch me, and the ref was like, 'It was only one foot.' I was like, 'Only one foot? Well, that's ok then!'

WHAT IS THE BEST GOAL YOU'VE EVER SEEN SCORED?

There have been quite a few over the years! Beth Merrick has scored a few, and then even Tammi pops up with one every so often, I remember last season she scored from just inside halfway, but I have two that come to mind because they were both in the same game. It was at Cheltenham away last year, and I thought Amber's was decent and then Beth scored another really good one as well, so I'd say those two.

WHICH OF YOUR WOLVES TEAMMATES HAS THE WORST DRESS SENSE?


Apparently I do! It's really difficult to say anyone because I only ever really see everybody when we're in kit and we don't often see each other in our actual clothes. When we come into training or on a matchday, we're always in our kit, so everyone is wearing the same stuff—so I don't actually know.

WHAT IS THE MOST UNEXPECTED RESULT YOU'VE HAD?

Even though I wasn't playing that game, as a group it was probably Reading in the FA Cup last year. As a team, we knew we could potentially get a result, but everybody else didn't expect it, when you see a Championship side going up against a third tier side. As much as I wasn't involved in the match, as a club, it was amazing, and then to be able to go on and play Brighton in the next round was really good.







One of the more calming voices on the sidelines, Lee Robinson joined the first team this season after starting his journey with the Old Gold working with the Under-16s.

Lee has always looked to progress his career and gain experience wherever he can, and has been watching football from a very early age as a sixyear-old season ticket holder at Leeds United.

His journey into coaching began near to his hometown in Tadcaster, where he was at York City, overseeing the women's section.

"I was looking after all of the teams, from the firsts down to the Under-9s and Under-10s," he said.

"Before my 10 years at York, I was straight into coaching at Leeds United in an apprenticeship role, coaching is just a real passion of mine.

"I wanted to move away from the role at York though and get back onto the grass and restart coaching, so when I applied for this job, I was really glad to be given the opportunity.

"It was very much a quick move into the first team. After a few months with the Under-16s Dan called me up to work alongside him and the other staff."

Lee had played at county and grassroots levels before finding his career in coaching, and learnt a lot on the pitch to bring into his career. Before a match weekend, Lee will sit with the likes of Dan and Josh Darlington to discuss the upcoming fixture, looking at individual players, their traits, on the pitch habits, and anything they can spot to provide vital information.

"On a matchday all the work is pretty much done from our side," he explained.

"I tend to support the players and give them little bits of information on our opposition. Once the team news comes out I sit down with Dan and Josh to see if the line-up matches what we predicted.

"We can then pass the relevant notes onto our players and set them up as best we can for when the game starts."

Having grown up away from the Midlands, Lee provides a fresh set of eyes to the squad. Dan McNamara has been with the team for a number of years, as has Josh, described by Lee as 'Mr Wolves'!

At the Hawthorns earlier this season, while all coaching staff and players alike were celebrating all eight goals, Lee noted that he could be the calmer voice and presence within the team.

"I think that's a good thing that I bring to the squad," he mentioned.

"The emotion that Macca and Darlo bring is superb, and I can sometimes step away from that and be more relaxed and calm.

"That balance has helped me, being that figure to bring everyone back after being emotive, jumping for joy."

After last week's fantastic derby win against West Bromwich Albion, it's all focus on today's opponents Burnley who we beat at Turf Moor by a goal to nil. For all coaching staff, their priority is to get the squad ready to go again, and as Lee recalls getting them prepared for the reverse fixture was no easy task.

"Going into Burnley away, we had just been beaten by Forest," Lee said.

"But we went into the game in high spirits, it was a different challenge. This time we have home advantage and we've got to impose ourselves more and really take it to them.

"I think the girls have shown every single week that they are more than capable of competing with the best in the league, especially with the support the club gets and the players we have.

"We just remind them all that we know if they compete at their best they can match whoever they come up against."



Burnley FC Women

Burnley FC Women is the official women's team of Burnley Football Club. From its inception in 1995 until 2018 it was known as Burnley FC Girls and Ladies.

The team currently competes in the Northern Premier Division of the FA Women's National League. The club and junior teams played in the local Lancashire Leagues for many years, Regional League.

In 2016 the management and operation of the club was transferred to Burnley FC in the Community, with Manager Matt Bee taking the reins.

The 2017/18 season saw the team qualify for the first-round proper of the Women's FA Cup for the first time in their history, going on to reach the third round, where they were eliminated by third-tier side Cardiff City. They were also promoted to Division One North of the FA Women's National League at the end of the same season.

In 2018 the club was rebranded as Burnley FC Women and in that season they won the league title, going on to celebrate back-to-back promotions, reaching the Northern Premier Division of the FA Women's National League, the third tier of the English women's game.

The following two seasons were curtailed early due to the Covid-19 before joining the Northwest Women's pandemic. However, the side enjoyed a positive run in the Women's FA Cup in early 2021, reaching the fourth round - the furthest stage they had ever reached in the prestigious competition. They beat league rivals AFC Fylde Women and Sunderland AFC Ladies to face Manchester United Women of the Women's Super League.

> In February 2021, it was announced that the women's team would be integrated into Burnley FC, as the club's new American owner Alan Pace sought to turn the women's team professional. May 2022 saw the appointment of Jonathan Morgan as head coach and several new faces joining the squad.

In February 2023, Morgan departed, and assistant coach Jav Bradford took interim charge. The Claret Women finished the 2022/23 season third in the table in a tightly fought top three made up of Wolves Women and eventual winners Nottingham Forest. In July 2023 the club announced Rebecca Sawiuk as the new women's manager and welcomed seven new signings ahead of the 2023/24 campaign.

Last season they finished as runnersup to a full-time Newcastle United. their highest ever league finish. They currently sit fourth in the table behind Stoke and Wolves and recently agreed to part ways with Sawiuk, with Louise Roberts assuming the interim head coach position until the end of the season. Last week she led the team to a third consecutive Lancashire FA Senior Cup title.


