Good afternoon,

Welcome to Molineux for a Black Country derby in this famous stadium and what promises to be a special occasion. We always enjoy playing here and it's great to have so many of our regular fans here to support us. I'd also like to welcome you if this is your first Wolves Women game - we really appreciate your support at an important time.

With only four league games left we're really getting to the climax of the season. And what a brilliant season it's been so far. I'm so proud of these players and what they've achieved, going toe to toe with a fully professional Burnley side as we both push for promotion to WSL 2 - the second tier of women's football.

With the women's league structure expanding this season there's an extra chance of promotion. As well as the top sides from both the Northern and Southern divisions going up, there's an extra place available which will go to the winner of a play-off between the second-placed teams in each division. I'm proud to say that our win last Sunday has already secured us a minimum of a second-place finish which is a phenomenal achievement at this point in the season.

Two weeks ago we were really disappointed to lose 1-0 to Burnley at Turf Moor - our first league defeat of the season. That puts Burnley in pole position for that top spot, but I've said to the girls that we need to push them all the way to the end of the season and be ready if they slip up. An FA apology came last week for the decision which may have cost us the equaliser we deserved and would have opened the game up. Bittersweet now but it shows how well we did perform on the day and were cruelly denied a potential result.

I was delighted with the way the players bounced back from that defeat with the 2-0 midweek win over Albion in the Birmingham County FA Challenge Cup semi-final, followed by last Sunday's 5-0 win over Loughborough Lightning in the league. There were some tired legs at the end of that game, but the team have shown their determination and never give up attitude, and we saw goals coming from all over the pitch.

Today will be the fourth time we've played Albion this season in all competitions so we certainly know them well. We've won two of those games, but Albion knocked us out of the League Cup, so we know what we're up against. Siobhan will have them well organised and ready to make things difficult for us.

Finally, we will hand out a 100th shirt to Beth Roberts today. A fan favourite and a huge personality in the dressing room, I am very proud of how Robbo has performed since coming to the club. Let's hope there's another 100 to come.

We'll need your vocal support which has been immense so far this season, both home and away. Let's make Molineux our fortress.

Enjoy the game - be loud and proud.





# LOUANNE WORSEY

## FIRST THING

I usually put music on straight away when I wake up. It's just anything that can get me kind of pumped up for the game, but also relaxed to try and settle any nerves. Then I'll go down and have breakfast, chat to my mum, but other than that, I'm quite chill in the mornings on a matchday.

## FOOD AND DRINK

It has to be three Weetabix for breakfast. It's something I've always had and I've always been the same throughout my career. But it has to be with hot milk, not cold. I just find it nicer to eat when it's warm. Then once I'm at the ground, I'll have one poached egg and beans on toast for my pre-match meal. That's always the same.

## TALKING A GOOD GAME

In the mornings, I'll speak to my family about the match. My mum gives me a little pep talk every time I leave for a game. She tells me to constantly run! Keep running and work hard are the words from her and it's the same pep talk every week, just before I leave the house. But then as soon as I get to the stadium, I'll give Quiggy a big hug. She's a massive hugger, but to be fair, we all are. I'll give all the girls a hug and then we'll all have the pre-match meal together.

## ON THE HEADPHONES

On the way in, I always listen to Taylor Swift in the car. I tend to stick with the happy ones, because I want to listen to songs which are going to keep me in a happy and positive frame of mind. But once we're in the changing room, Robbo is our DJ. To be fair, she's added a few more songs onto the playlist for me, a couple of Taylor Swift songs, but we all add what we like to the playlist, especially if a new song comes out. Fortunately, we all have quite similar music tastes, so there's nothing we don't like, and it's also good that at our home ground at Telford, they give us the freedom to also have our music played while we're out doing the warm-up.

## BUS BUDDIES

There's not really a set seating arrangement on the bus to away games, but everyone tends to stick with the same people. It's usually me, AJ, Quigs, Georgia and Abi Loydon. KJ is always near, but we all flip and float around the bus and have a chat with everyone, so it's quite nice and shows the spirit we've got in the group that everyone gets on. We're all really together and it's not really separate at all.

## AT THE GROUND

When I first get to a ground I'll go into the changing room and I'll take my boots out, my shin pads out, and lay them nicely, because I'm quite OCD like that. Then I'll get all my wash stuff out for after the game. I'm definitely a very organised person, and if anyone comes into my space, I hate it! I don't like anything that will overstimulate me, but the girls aren't really that messy, so it's good when everything's nice and organised. Then I'll go out to see the pitch. If it's a 3G, then there's not really much to see, because they're all the same, but if it's grass, then you'll just assess what it's like and what boots you'll need. But I always have to put my left shin pad into my sock before my right, and my left boot on before my right.

## GAME MODE

As soon as Macca comes into the changing room, about 10 minutes before kick-off, then that's when we know it's time. We'll all be dancing and singing in the changing room because the spirits will be high, but then as soon as he comes in, we calm down, and I'll have five minutes to myself, sat down in my space and I'll try and lock in for the game, focusing on the game, on my job, and what I can do for the team.

## POST-MATCH PLANS

Our mood after the game all depends on the result. If we win, then we'll be listening to music, everyone will be jolly and everyone will stay around for a lot longer than we need to, just

talking about the game. But if we if we lose, we'll all go back into the changing room and it's dead silent. People will be talking about the game, but others will try to shoot off as quickly as you can because nobody really wants to be around as it really affects everyone. But I'll always have some post-match food immediately and after will usually pick pizza. I like tuna on my pizza, and I know that's not a popular opinion, but I'll also be happy with a margherita or a pepperoni.

## SWITCHING OFF

I find it really hard to switch off and get really affected by the results, especially if they're bad ones – if you ask my family, they'll know it's best not to speak to me! But it works both ways. If it's a good result, and you've played well, then you're on the top of the world and you can't wait to go back into training, whereas if it's a bad result, you're kind of dreading it because everyone's feeling deflated, but when you're on a high, it's really good and you're just full of confidence.

## WBA Women

Formed in 1989 and playing local and recreation football, it wasn't until 1995 that the team entered competitive football and joined the West Midlands Women's Regional League under the name of West Bromwich Albion Women's FC. However, they were representing the men's club in little more than name only until 2004/05 when the then WBA Community Programme embraced the team via their Girls' and Women's Football Development Programme.

WBA Women's FC then made an extensive commitment alongside the Community Programme to develop the junior section and reserve team, which provided a solid player pathway for the following four seasons.

In the summer of 2009, The Albion Foundation took on the girls' teams in a full management capacity, aligning with the Sporting Club Albion concept alongside the disability and basketball teams.

This development quickly proved hugely successful, as in their second season under the Sporting Club Albion umbrella, the women's team clinched the Midlands Combination title and gained promotion to the FA Women's Premier League.

The summer of 2011 went on to become a great time for girls' football at Sporting Club Albion following the announcement of the creation of the Girls' FA Centre of Excellence, further adding to the ethos of working with and developing young talented players from the Albion community. They settled into their new league quite comfortably in that 2011/12 season, finishing in a creditable mid-table position.

A further season of consolidation saw them repeat the mid-table position before the rejigged Premier League had them in the northern section where, after an initial struggle, they again finished mid-table. By previous standards the 2014/15 season was a poor one for Albion as they struggled throughout the season, eventually finishing tenth.

The following season was one of great fortune for Albion as they reached the unprecedented heights of winning the Northern Division after a campaign in which they dropped only two points on home turf. They went into a play-off with Southern Division champions Brighton & Hove Albion, but suffered defeat.

The name changed back to West Bromwich Albion for 2016/17 and a poor season followed with a mid-table finish. Worse was to follow as they finished bottom of the pile in 2017/18 and dropped into Midlands Division One, however, that was only for a season as they charged to the title first time out.


The team have consolidated over the past six seasons and now under head coach Siobhan Hodgetts-Still have enjoyed semi-final runs in both the FA WNL Cup and Birmingham County FA Challenge Cup this season and currently sit fifth in the league table.






