














FASHION, FOOD, FUN

MATCH REPORT

Wolves **2** (Morphet 6, Bedeau 33) - **1** Liverpool Feds (Cole 46) FA WNL I Sunday 9th April 2023

Wolves Women ground out another important win in front of 426 fans at the New Bucks Head on Easter Sunday.

A sharp start was rewarded in the sixth minute for the old gold. A Beth Merrick corner came floating into the box and after a scramble involving multiple players and a toe from Destiney Toussaint who attempted to get the ball over the line, it was fumbled into the back of the net by Anna Morphet at the back post to give Dan McNamara's side the early lead.

Wolves continued to play on the front foot throughout the first 45, with a lot of balls being played over the visitors' defence, but the positioning of keeper Rachel Darbyshire was enough to deny any effort from a lofted ball over her back line, much to Wolves' frustration who couldn't quite get the connections they wanted from those balls.

It was a dream first start for youngster Naomi Bedeau who doubled the lead shortly after the half hour mark. Toussaint laid the ball out to the defender following a goal-mouth scramble, and she hit it powerfully into the roof of the net to open her account for the club.

The visitors upped the tempo as half-time loomed, testing Shan Turner in between the sticks, but their efforts couldn't find the back of the net and Wolves went into the break two goals to the good.

The start of the second half was one to forget for Wolves as they conceded straight from kick-off. Paige Cole scored for the visitors to help them find a way back into the game; a goal that changed the dynamic for the rest of the afternoon.

Wolves didn't look the same fiery side seen in the first half and they set out more to defend the higher line of Liverpool Feds rather than trying to increase the gap in the score-line.

However, Toussaint almost got her name on the scoresheet, capitalising on some poor defending from Feds, but her effort glided past the front of goal, with no one around the area to retrieve the ball and take a shot.

The team from Merseyside were unlucky not to get an equaliser when Katie Thomas struck an effort towards goal that came back to her from keeper Turner and she tried her luck again, but her second attempt went wide.

Wolves still had chances which they could have capitalised on towards the end of the game, but their efforts weren't enough to trouble Darbyshire and the home side were able to see out the 90 minutes for another important three points.

Despite it not being the best performance by Wolves' and McNamara's standards, especially in the second half, the Wolves boss knew the three points was all that mattered in the end.

"I think we started quite lively, moving the ball well," he said. "It's always easy to stand here and say we weren't at our best, but I think Liverpool Feds were one of the best footballing sides we've played this year; the way they moved the ball, it was fantastic, and they caused us some real problems with a 3-5-2.

"Disappointed by our own performance, and certainly after the break we didn't match our own standards. I don't think we came out after half-time, and we conceded within 25 seconds, and that's not the Wolves we've come to know and love, but it's three points on the board and at this stage in the season that's important."

On the importance of the fans at this stage of the season

"Anything can happen, and football is football. The league is all but done with Forest now, they've got a commanding position with their goal difference and there's not a lot we can do to control that, but what we can control, is that if they slip up, we're there to capitalise.

"The fans helped us through difficult moments. With five minutes to play, Tammi got onto the ball and the fans roared to give her that extra energy to get us up the pitch and that's the difference.

"It's great to hear them when you're winning, but in the tough moments when you really need them, that's when they're really important and it was great to see so many here, and hopefully we see many more at the County Cup Final."





SHAN TURNER

Solihull-born Shan Turner joined the old gold in the summer of 2021 from Boldmere St Michaels and kept 13 clean sheets as she helped Wolves to collect two pieces of silverware in her first season at the club.

A physical presence between the sticks, Turner's footballing journey goes beyond Wolves to the international stage. She was part of Northern Ireland's first ever Women's Euros squad last summer and on Thursday 6th April this year, opened a new chapter as she made her first senior international appearance.

Read on to find out how she's enjoying this new strand of her footballing life...

Going back to the Euros, what was your initial reaction when you found out you were being selected?

"The initial reaction was shock. I had only been involved three or four weeks before, so it was pure shock, but excitement too because I was going to such a big tournament and it was also Northern Ireland's first one, so it was a good feeling."

How supportive was everyone at Wolves when they found out, especially Hugh and the goalkeeping staff?

"They absolutely loved it. Obviously, Hugh is from Northern Ireland himself, so for him it was massive and when I joined Wolves, I said it's what I wanted to do. I wanted to get back in their setup and the team, so it was massive for him and for the club."

Most people dream about representing their country when they start out, was that a dream you had?

"Yeah 100%. You always want to get as far as you can when you play football. My dream was to be a professional footballer, but going into the international set-up, I was there in the under 19s, to then get re-called up for the seniors, it's huge for me."

Did you know any of the girls when you joined last year and if not, how welcoming were they all?

"When I first came in, I knew a couple from when I was younger, but I didn't know anyone really well. I spent two weeks over there full-time and then we were at the Euros for two weeks, so the more I was there and the more I was involved, the more I got to know people and become part of their little bubble during that time."

What was it like being in that professional environment and experiencing the buzz of the tournament?

"The overall experience was just incredible. The buzz around Southampton, where we were based, was crazy. We had England in our group and there were around 30,000 people in the stadium, which even when you're not playing, is an amazing experience. It was a massive learning curve for me, but the experience topped it all."

Northern Ireland fans are known for their passion, so what was it like seeing that first hand?

"They were brilliant. No matter what game we were at, they were the ones you could hear, even in the England game with all the England fans, they were still the ones you could hear. They had a big drum with them that you heard at every game and the support from them is just immense."




You've now been selected for a couple of camps since then and made your debut against Wales; talk me through those feelings.

"It was very nerve-wracking. It was my first start and my first cap against Wales, who are a good country. Despite the result (Wales 4 Northern Ireland 1) it was a great experience, and I was honoured to get that chance. The result wasn't what we wanted, but hopefully it's something I can build on now and hopefully get more caps in the future."

Wolves is a professional set up, but what's the biggest thing you've learnt from being in an international set-up?

"The international stage is massive. When you go to different countries and play against different teams and everything that comes with it, you see the level of difference. Playing against Wales, we played against WSL players and professional footballers, and you realise how much of a step-up it is. The speed and tempo of the game also makes me want to get to that level and be quicker and better."

TODAY'S OPPONENTS

DERBY COUNTY





The club was formed in 1990 and since that time has grown organically from just a single senior team to be the largest girls' and women's club in the Derbyshire area, with teams at every age level from Under 8s upwards.

In 2014 they were chosen as the Charter Standard Development Club of the year by the Derbyshire County FA and in 2015 and 2018 became FA Women's Premier League Club of the year.

It was in 2008/09 that the first team completed a league and cup double to win the Midland Combination League and gain promotion to the FA Women's Premier League for the first time in their history.

They have achieved a number of top four finishes in the newly branded FA Women's National League Northern Premier Division since its launch, their best finishing position being last year when they narrowly missed out on top place, finishing second to our own Wolves Women.

Sam Griffiths became head coach in 2018/19 after a long association with the club as a player.

A closer association with the men's club has also led to Derby County Women playing some fixtures at Pride Park against Nottingham Forest, with attendances regularly around the 3,000 mark. Late last month an impressive 5,243 people watched this season's encounter.

The club makes excellent provision for junior players to move through the ranks to open age football with over 60% of the current senior squad starting their Derby County careers in the academy.

Every team within the club has a partner rather than a sponsor, and the relationships they have with these partners saw them through a difficult period when the men's club went into administration recently. With new owners now openly backing the women's arm of the club, they remain focused on the Championship as their next goal.

In 2021 the club became a stakeholder in Mickleover FC, giving them a permanent home where they now play their home games.


