BETH MERRICK'S FA CUP LOVE STORY!

For Beth Merrick, the magic of the FA Cup is still shining bright.

The iconic Wolves Women midfielder has been in incredible form for Dan McNamara's side this season, already finding the net nine times in the opening three months of the campaign, but in previous years, it's been the FA Cup which has seemed to get the goalscoring best out of number 28.

Some of Merrick's favourite memories of watching football have been from her season ticket seat in the North Bank as she witnesses the men's first-team claim almighty scalps in the FA Cup, especially under the Molineux lights.

And with Stoke City the visitors to the SEAH Stadium for a second round tie in front of the TNT cameras this evening, she now has the opportunity to recreate those moments with her teammates.

"I love the FA Cup," Merrick said. "Regardless of whether you play men's or women's football, it's something that everybody can relate to and everyone loves to watch on TV. It's the kind of thing that gets you into football when you were younger.

"I remember going to Wolves and watching so many FA Cup games when I was younger because I didn't initially have a season ticket, and those games are just special. It's always about having that underdog feeling, it's David versus Goliath, and that's why I love it."

Since returning to Wolves back in 2021, Merrick has had an unbelievable knack of scoring in the competition. In her 17 FA Cup appearances for the Old Gold in that time, she's scored 12 goals, including some of the most memorable strikes in recent history as her goals have helped the team reach the fifth round for the last two seasons.

"I don't know why I always seem to score in the FA Cup," she admits. "I've started really well this year with goals, whereas in other years, I've tended to save them for the cup, but I don't know why that is.

"The league obviously means so much as well, but it's just a feeling you get that with the FA Cup I don't think you can replicate. It's not only been a thing for the last couple of years, I think it's been all the way through my career, but I have no explanation to it. I just have to keep it up now!"

Merrick's first FA Cup goal in gold and black came during the 2022/23 season when she was one of five scorers in a dominant first round win over Shrewsbury Town, before adding her second in the next round against Northampton Town. She then bagged a brace against Newcastle United in round three to set up a fourth round tie with Super League side West Ham United.

Although there were rare cup blanks for Merrick in the opening rounds of the 2023/24 campaign, her three goals in the next three games have become some of her most remarkable moments in Old Gold. First came a last minute goal away at Hull City in the third round, setting up a tantalising away clash with then-Championship club Reading at Aldershot Town's EBB Stadium.

"Most of our overriding memories of Reading was that we all ended up having food poisoning from that game! However, it was probably one of my proudest moments in football, not just the goal, but the whole game.



"It was probably the first time that we'd done something amazing as a group, and something that when we look back on it, really unified and brought the group together."

Merrick's goal against Reading not only secured Wolves a place in the fifth round for the first time in modern FA Cup history, but her celebration – arms stretched out wide like she was about to take off, with a face full of jubilant celebration and tears in her eyes – will go down as one of Wolves Women's most iconic images.

"Every year, when we come to do the photo shoot at the start of the season, I get asked what my celebration is, but how would you describe what that is? I don't know why I did it, I think it was just pure emotion!

"I wouldn't say it's the best photo of me, but it obviously shows exactly what the FA Cup means." Then it was Brighton at New Bucks Head. Despite falling behind in the first half, Wolves produced an incredible performance to not only keep themselves in the game against a WSL team littered with internationals but get themselves level from the penalty spot.

With normal penalty taker Anna Morphet absent, there were no surprises on who was the one to face the pressure and score the spot kick.

"I have never been as nervous as I was in that moment. Everyone looked at me to take it and there was a bit of discussion around who it should be.

"I felt we could have won that game and could have done something, but we lost it in the last couple of minutes, which is a real shame. But to push a Super League team all the way like we did was incredible."

Last season was another momentous occasion for Merrick and Wolves Women. Getting to the fifth round of the FA Cup for a third tier outfit is incredibly rare, so to do it twice in two seasons is what sets this Wolves side apart from others. After avoiding a banana skin in the first round with a trip to Asfordby Amateurs, another goal followed for the midfielder against Sporting Khalsa, before she added a brace in the third round against Shrewsbury.

Merrick was once again up for the cup as she added a decisive second against a Cheltenham Town side who had already ended one of Wolves' cup runs, as a goal in every round so far helped to secure a mouth-watering home tie against WSL giants Manchester United.

"I know Macca wanted Liverpool, and some of the girls wanted Arsenal, so pulling Man United out was amazing. The game was special, but it equally didn't go the way that we wanted. We didn't let ourselves down, but we didn't carry out the game plan like we did against Brighton.

"It was still a very special night and a historic night for the club with a record attendance. The atmosphere felt amazing and the reception we got from the fans who came out just shows how special this club can be."

That brings us on to tonight's second round tie. Having already faced Stoke twice this season, Merrick knows just how difficult a task it's going to be if her side are to make it a hat-trick over the Potters.

From witnessing so many incredible FA Cup nights under the lights at Molineux, she's now hoping the magic of the cup will shine at the SEAH Stadium – but this time with her on the pitch and scoring for her beloved Old Gold.

"We know how tough Stoke are. They've got some great quality players that we know a lot about, but previous results go out of the window when it's an FA Cup game, and there'll be no holding back from either team.

"Being selected for TV on a Friday night is another massive milestone for this club. It gives us a chance to put ourselves on the map to a massively wider audience, and I know each and every person that's connected to the club will be so proud of the evening. As long as we get the right result."

Stoke City

Stoke City's women's team was inaugurated in the summer of 2001, and they've been climbing the leagues ever since. The inaugural season in the West Midlands League Division One ended in success as the Potters finished third in the table and gained promotion via the play-offs.

From there, the team consolidated their position in the West Midlands Premier Division and began entering into the Staffordshire County Ladies Challenge Cup. A first Challenge Cup final was reached in 2007, which they won, and they have now lifted the trophy 16 times, with the most recent success in the 2025 final.

Promotion to the Midlands Women's Combination League was secured in 2009 as the team finished as champions, whilst a historic treble was

earned in 2013 as they scooped the league championship, League Cup and County Cup. That title saw them promoted to the FA Women's National League North where they continue to play to this day.

The Potters reached the final of the FA Women's National League Cup in 2020, however, due to the COVID-19 pandemic the final never took place. In 2023, the team developed to semi-professional status, following significant investment from the club's ownership.

The owners' financial commitment aims to bring success to the women's team but, more importantly, encourage young girls in Stoke-on-Trent and Staffordshire to participate in the sport.

Meanwhile, the Potters' form continued in cup competitions with their run to the Adobe Women's FA Cup Fourth Round, their best in five years, while defeats of Wolves, Barnsley, Liverpool Feds, Burnley and Plymouth Argyle booked their spot in the FA Women's National League Cup for only the second time in the club's history.

Following the conclusion of the 2024/25 campaign, the club appointed Sarah Richardson as the new Head Coach of their women's first team, while also announcing long-term plans to put local talent at the heart of its strategy for women's and girls' football through a new Elite Girls' Academy programme.

FIRST THING

The main routine for me, really, is my eating. I wake up at different times depending on who we've got. If we're at home, I'll wake up a bit later, if we're away, I'll obviously get up earlier, but as soon as I get up, I will always have three scrambled eggs on toast and a cup of tea.

FOOD AND DRINK

As well as the tea, I'll drink loads of electrolyte water, then about 11am, I'll have two bananas and a little pot of rice pudding and then that's me for the morning. This routine has changed a bit over time, but I feel like I've finally found the perfect combo. Last season, I was doing four pancakes and honey because I saw Declan Rice do it, so I thought I'd give that a go, but I just felt so heavy and stodgy.

ON THE HEADPHONES

Whether I'm on the way to Telford or Wolves, I'll always have some music on in my car. Usually, it's chilled country music because I find that relaxes me, especially with there still being quite a few hours before the game. I don't want to get too hyped up just yet. When we're in the changing room, it's all songs that the girls have put into a playlist, and they're quite upbeat, which gets me hyped. I took on the role of DJ last season as Beth Merrick did it for ages, but when she left for a few months and before she came back, I just picked it up. It's a job where you can't please everyone, but I feel I know people's music tastes now, so I've got a bit of everything in the playlist.

TALKING A GOOD GAME

When we get to Telford for a home matchday, I sit on a table with Amber [Hughes], Char [Greengrass], Ando [Becky Anderson], Beth [Merrick], Morph [Anna Morphet] and Thommo [Bec Thomas], and they're the people who I tend to talk to ahead of the game. It's not always about football, it's usually more general stuff, just talking about life, and we tend to talk about football more after the game. In the mornings it's a lot of random chat.

I can't even think about some of the stuff we talk about because it's so random.

BUS BUDDIES

On the bus, if we've got a long away game, I'm usually sat with the same people. But it was quite good on the way back from Sudbury the other weekend as we were playing musical statues, which was pretty funny. This won't come as a shock to anyone, but it was Abi Loydon's idea. Alex [Brooks] was on the music and Abi and Chloe [Williams] were the judges. We'd stand up in our seats or in the aisle and when the music stopped, we'd have to pause. But obviously it didn't end well and most of the girls just kept dancing.

AT THE GROUND

The first thing I do when I get to a ground is go in the changing room, go to where my spot is, put my bag down and get my boots and my shin pads out so my station's all set up and ready to go. I always like to go and take a look at the pitch, regardless if it's astro or grass, and have a good look at it. If it is grass, I always wear studs, so it's not like I'm checking the pitch, but I'm superstitious with wearing studs. But once I've done that I'll go back to my station and try to relax.

GAME MODE

I try not to think about the match too much. I enjoy a bit of a joke with the girls and just have a chat to them as that seems to get me in my best headspace for a game. But as soon as I start getting ready and put the kit on, that's when I get a bit of a buzz, especially with the music on, and everyone else is getting ready. That's when everyone begins to get very serious and locked in, so everyone's on the same page.

POST-MATCH PLANS

I'm always starving after a game. As soon as it's finished, the moment the whistle is gone, I'm always so hungry. If there's any wine gums left or cereal bars, I'll have one of them. But once we get back in the changing room I'll always have a shower, wash my hair, have a protein shake and then go and run to the post match food because I'm so hungry. At the moment, Sunday for me has turned into a bit of a fish and chips day. Me and my boyfriend have fish and chips every Sunday, but a lot of the time I'll still have the post-match food. They do a lovely lasagna at Telford, so every home game we're always hoping it will be the lasagna.

SWITCHING OFF

After the game, you're always just thinking about what's happened. I like to talk about it to people, look back at how it's gone and just try to process what's happened. But then as it gets later on in the night, I just try and switch off, whether that's watching telly or doing something else. I'm a lot better at switching off now than when I was younger, because back then a bad result would ruin my night and ruin my week, but now I just try and think about what I can control, try and look forward to the week ahead, and just try and stay positive. However, if it's a night game like Stoke, I'm really going to struggle switching off because I literally won't get to sleep until 2am, but with the earlier games on a Sunday, I do feel like I have the time to process it and try to forget about it.
