# THE RACE FOR THE GOLDEN BOOT



As we head into our final matchday of the 2024/25 season, the race for the FA WNL Northern Division Golden Boot award is on and with the two front-runners both Wolves players.

Charlotte Greengrass leads the way with 21 league goals, while strike partner Amber Hughes is hot on her heels with 20. Nottingham Forest's Mel Johnson is currently in third place with 17 goals.

Today's fixture will hopefully decide who joins Amy McCann and Jade Cross in the Wolves record books. McCann won the Northern Division trophy with 21 goals in 2004/05 and Cross hit 29 to claim the award in the 2018/19 Division One Midlands campaign.

This season has seen the lead change a couple of times, Greengrass nudging ahead after scoring a hat-trick in the 6-1 win last time out at Halifax.

But in her debut season for the club, she doesn't mind who wins the cherished award. "I think me and Amber joke about it," she says, "but as long as one of us wins it I'm happy because I think it's reflective of the team and how good we've been as a team.

"Winning the Golden Boot would be lovely, but as long as we're winning and pushing for whatever we can then I'm happy."

Meanwhile Hughes has scored an impressive total of 92 league and Cup goals in 104 games for the club and is delighted with this season's haul.

"Personally, I wanted to add more than I did last season," she says, "so I'm happy - but I'm always looking to do more.

"It's been great getting Char coming in and adding to the strike partnership and somebody else to get the goals, which she has in abundance."

Manager Dan McNamara is delighted with the pair. "I think the partnership that Charlotte and Amber have put together over this season is unbelievable," he says.

"Forty league goals between them is phenomenal over a 22-game season - working at two goals a game between them is ridiculous.

"The way that they've been this year has been remarkable, and hopefully one of them will go on to win the Golden Boot."

# ABBI JENNER

Defender Abbi Jenner is the final player to sit in the programme hot seat this season and answer a few quirky questions.

## WHAT IS THE MOST MEMORABLE PLACE YOU'VE PLAYED FOOTBALL?

We've played at a lot of the big stadiums this season, so it's got to be one of them. It would either be the City Ground or Turf Moor because they were both really nice stadiums, but I'd probably say Turf Moor because we won there as well, so that made it better. The pitches are nice and suit our style of play, so it's been better for us to play at the big stadiums, and even behind the scenes, the changing rooms are bigger, better, nicer, and everything about playing at them is just better.

## WHAT ARE THE STRANGEST SUPERSTITIONS YOU'VE SEEN FROM TEAMMATES?

It's got to be Tammi George and going to the toilet at the latest possible moment before we go out. It's the most annoying thing ever. At Hull away, kick-off was delayed and she ended up going three times because she said it was the last thing she has to do. I said to her that she surely didn't need a wee anymore, but she was adamant that she could wee if she needs to! She ended up going three times because we were stood waiting forever.

## WHAT IS THE GREATEST COMEBACK YOU'VE BEEN INVOLVED IN?

I'd have to say it was on my debut for Birmingham City. We were two-nil down against London City Lionesses and there was about 12 minutes to go and I came on for my debut at 16 and we actually managed to end up drawing 2-2. Because it was the Conti Cup, it went to penalties and we ended up winning the penalty shoot-out to get the extra point.

## WHICH OF YOUR WOLVES TEAMMATES HAS THE WORST TASTE IN MUSIC?

This is a difficult one to answer because Robbo [Beth Roberts] is always on the music and we have a team playlist. The problem is that everyone just puts their own songs onto the playlist so we all listen to the same stuff. There are sometimes a couple of songs that come on when we're asking, 'Who's this?' But no-one ever owns up! We have a mix of everything because there's a broad range of ages in the group, and although I'm one of the youngest, I do know a lot of the older songs as well.

## WHAT IS THE STRANGEST MOMENT YOU'VE EXPERIENCED IN A GAME?

Our last game away at Halifax, and I did feel sorry for them because their number nine held the ball up, was fouled, and fell onto the ball. The ref blew the whistle, gave them a free-kick, but then she's handballed it after the whistle, so then the ref has given us the free-kick instead. But the ref had already blown the whistle! We didn't say anything because we got the free-kick so we didn't mind but their manager obviously got very angry. I just couldn't believe it. It was very bizarre.

## WHO IS THE BIGGEST CHARACTER IN A DRESSING ROOM YOU'VE BEEN IN?

At Birmingham, I played with Lucy Quinn, the Ireland international, and she's just a very, very big character. But she's also someone that you need in the dressing room, she's funny, she always got the mood going, no matter what the time was. Sometimes it'll be seven in the morning at training and she's crazy, but she's a very professional player as well and someone I always looked up to and learned from.



## WHAT IS THE ODDEST THING YOU'VE HEARD SAID DURING A MATCH?

We had a friendly the other week and the referee was a bit controversial in the game. She gave a foul against us and we were all saying it was for us. All of the opposition players were saying it was a free-kick for us, but Tammi said she heard the ref put her finger to her ear and say to the lino, 'Next time could you tell me who to give it to because I don't know!' You're the ref – surely you should know who you're giving a free-kick to!

## WHAT IS THE BEST GOAL YOU'VE EVER SEEN SCORED?

I've got to give it to Beth Merrick. She's scored so many – I think one in the FA Cup against Shrewsbury, and even Halifax two weeks ago, so it's definitely one of hers. But I've got to say Charlotte Greengrass scores some worldies in training. The other night, she was on my team and we were 3-1 down and then she pulls out a hat-trick and we were winning with these crazy goals. From the tightest angles, she'll somehow find the back of the net.

## WHICH OF YOUR WOLVES TEAMMATES HAS THE WORST DRESS SENSE?

Abi Loydon. It's so easy. There's no other answer. What she wears is quirky, but I honestly wouldn't wear anything she wears, even down to her sunglasses – which look like cycling glasses – which she wears even when it's 10 degrees outside. It's definitely her, but her style is what makes her her. It's always a case of, 'What's Abi Loydon going to be wearing today?'

## WHAT IS THE MOST UNEXPECTED RESULT YOU'VE HAD?

There was the one against Burnley at Turf Moor earlier this season. Away from home, we'd just lost to Forest the week before, we were going through a rough patch and playing at their men's stadium and a big pitch, so to come through that and win there was big. You could even say the 8-0 win against West Brom at the Hawthorns. Although people expected us to win, you don't expect to beat them 8-0. I had never played in a Black Country derby before, and after we'd scored a couple I was thinking, 'What's going on? Does this normally happen?' But that 8-0 was crazy.

# THE SEASON IN REVIEW

**The 2024/25 campaign for Wolves Women has been one of the best the club has seen for a long time, competing at the top right until the very end.**

The opening day victory at home to Stourbridge seems so long ago, yet the 4-0 result was an early sign of things to come for Dan McNamara's side.

Prior to that opening victory, there was plenty of news to shout about for the Old Gold. Dan became the first full-time manager of the club, and there were some new faces added to the squad too including forward Charlotte Greengrass.

There were of course, a few early setbacks. A 3-1 loss to Stoke in the League Cup determining round meant that for the first time in the club's history, they would compete in the National League Plate. Shortly after that the team suffered their only league defeat of the season to date here at the SEAH Stadium to top of the table Forest.

However, a well-earned 2-2 draw at the bet365 Stadium away at Stoke set Dan McNamara's side on an incredible run of form. Wolves were even close to taking all three points, with a Becky Anderson strike falling narrowly wide of the target.

A win against Fylde in the League Plate, followed by a swift victory against Rugby Borough at home, moved us on to the first Black Country derby of the season at The Hawthorns.

Not many would have seen the 8-0 scoreline coming, but with Greengrass scoring four, Tammi George at the double, and additional goals from Beth Merrick and Jade Cross, the Old Gold claimed yet another derby day victory. It was one to remember, especially on away soil.

The squad's record victory came in the Birmingham Senior Cup, away at Coventry Sphinx. Goals were shared around the team as Wolves progressed with a 16-0 win, which coincided with the start of another fantastic FA Cup campaign.

Wolves started their FA Cup adventure away to Asfordby Amateurs, winning 7-1. It was then two home ties against Sporting Khalsa and Shrewsbury, before a fourth round clash at Cheltenham Town where they had lost earlier in the season in the League Plate competition.

A dominant 2-0 victory in Bishops Cleeve put Wolves into the fifth round for the second year running, and the resulting draw pitted the Old Gold against holders Manchester United at home.



This triggered a record attendance at the SEAH Stadium of just over 5000, with plenty of United supporters making the journey from Manchester.

It wasn't to be for Wolves on the night, as the visitors scored six without reply. Bec Thomas made some fantastic saves throughout, but the pack couldn't quite find the back of the net.

The phrase making memories has been sewn into the Wolves squad over the last few years, and once again the Cup journey, and league season have created some fantastic memories for players, staff, and supporters alike.

It was back to league action though for Dan's squad, which towards the tail end of the season saw Wolves earn a fantastic point away to Forest at The City Ground. Once again, Charlotte Greengrass found the target early in the second half to bring the game to 1-1.

Throughout the season, plenty of goals have been shared, but it's both Amber Hughes and Charlotte Greengrass who have led the way at the top of the scoring charts. Amber was able to get her say in the return league game against Albion in a 5-0 win at Molineux.

Her second half strike added to a growing list of goals against the Black Country rivals.

Wolves Women have been pushing on all season at the top of the National League North and have come so close to winning the league. Perhaps a 3-3 draw at Hull was the turning point, but regardless it has been an incredible season for all involved.

Last time out away at Halifax, it was yet another dominant performance which led to the 6-1 victory.

**The team will go into this afternoon's game against Liverpool Feds with their heads held high, and let's make sure that we all get behind them for one final time this season and generate as much noise as possible!**





## Liverpool Feds FC Women

Liverpool Feds were formed in 1990, originating from the Liverpool Institute of Higher Education (now known as Liverpool Hope University). The Feds moniker originates from the Liverpool Institute of Higher Education College where the sports teams played as a Federation of the St Katherine's and Christ Notre Dame Colleges.

They commenced competitive football in the North West Women's Regional League and made steady progress. With player numbers increasing they added a reserve team in 1993 which was swiftly followed by a girls' youth section which played in the Liverpool County FA Girls' League. Natural progression saw a development squad and Under-18s born as the overall club evolved. The youth section these days gives an opportunity to over 150 girls each week to learn and play football.

Having stabilised themselves in their early years they progressed through to the Premier Division of the North West Regional League in the late 1990s and went on to challenge at the top of the league in the early 2020s.

They finished in the top four over five successive seasons, but were never able to capture the title.

That all changed in 2008/09 when they completed the entire league campaign unbeaten, drawing only three games. That title success saw them promoted to the Northern Women's Combination, the fourth tier of the women's game.

It took them a while to adapt to the higher league levels, hovering around the lower half of the table for the five seasons they were in the Northern Combination. The summer of 2014 saw a reorganisation of the women's pyramid with the Combination leagues joining the FA Women's Premier League, a change which saw Feds move into League Division One North. That season was their best at this level, and they finished as runners-up.

The summer of 2015 was one of change as they linked up with Marshalls FC with their name becoming Liverpool Marshall Feds.

This alliance lasted for three years, a period in which the team finished runners-up twice and third before the club opted to break away, reverting to Liverpool Feds in the summer of 2018.

The following season they won the Liverpool County Cup for the second time before Covid struck and wiped out football for the best part of two years. In 2021/22 Leanne Duffy's side finally captured the League Division One North crown at the eighth attempt, pipping Newcastle to the title.

To match that triumph, they won the County Cup again and made it through to the semi-finals of the FA Women's Premier League Cup, losing narrowly to Huddersfield Town.

A solid first season in the third tier was followed by an improved eighth place finish in 2023/24. As a self-funded, female only club ranging from Under-6s to walking football, the Feds continue to defy the odds and will be looking for another improved finish in 2024/25.


