About This Guide





Arriving by car



By road from the north

Exit M6 at junction 12. At island take third exit onto A5 for Wolverhampton. At the next island turn left onto A449. After six miles the A449 passes under the M54. Carry straight on and at the sixth island (Five Ways) take the third exit onto Waterloo Road. Molineux is one mile straight on.

By road from the south east

Exit M6 at junction 10. Take A454 via Willenhall to Wolverhampton Ring Road. At first Ring Road island, take the fourth exit (A449 to Stafford). Straight on at next two sets of traffic lights. Filter right at third set of lights into Waterloo Road. Molineux is 500 yards on the right.

By road from the south west

Exit M5 at junction 2. Follow the signs for Wolverhampton on the A4123 for eight miles to the Ring Road. Turn left on Ring Road, following signs for Molineux. Take second exit at next two islands, pass Banks's Brewery and swimming baths on left and then turn left at next set of traffic lights. Molineux is 500 yards on the right.

Car Parking

Road closure information

A number of road closures around the stadium as part of spectator safety measures will affect supporters on matchdays. Please refer to the road closure map and information below for details.

Waterloo Road

Will be closed from the roundabout leading to ASDA up to the traffic lights at Newhampton Road from 90 minutes before kick off up until a period at the discretion of the Matchday Safety Officer at the end of the game. (expected to be between 15 and 30 minutes).

Molineux Street / Sir Jack Hayward Way




Arriving by car




Post Code for SAT NAV: WV1 4QR

Wolves have an accessible drop off zone where supporters can have family or friends drive as close to the stadium for drop off and pick up. This is located on the Stan Cullis car park.

Visiting clubs are allocated with five passes for accessible away parking, to be purchased directly through the visiting club.

Road closure information



Parking and Arrival


The accessible car park is located in front of the Stan Cullis Stand and is accessed via Jack Hayward Way. It is an open-air, surface-level tarmac facility with step-free access. A height restriction of 220cm (7ft 3in) is in place, and the car park operates a staffed barrier control system.



Clearly marked Blue Badge parking bays are available, measuring approximately 370cm x 480cm (12ft 2in x 15ft 9in) with a 120cm hatched access zone. These bays are located 4–11m from the outer concourse. On matchdays, Blue Badge parking must be pre-booked via the Club Ticket Office, and spaces are allocated on a match-by-match basis. Standard parking bays may also be used by Blue Badge holders where required. Parking charges apply to all users, including Blue Badge holders, unless otherwise specified for certain memberships.

A steward is available on matchdays to provide assistance. Twenty-two additional accessible parking spaces are available for supporters with hidden disabilities. Parent and child bays are not provided. The route from the car park to the stadium is fully accessible and can be used independently by wheelchair users.

Arriving by train or bus



Arriving by train

Wolverhampton Railway Station, Railway Dr, West Midlands, Wolverhampton WV1 1LE

Wolverhampton Railway Station is around a 15 minute walk away from Molineux. From the main station entrance proceed straight on towards the city centre and as you reach the inner ring road turn right. Just follow the ring road as it continues in a circular pattern around to the left. Eventually you will see the Molineux on the right. West Midlands Trains operates high-speed trains to and from London and regional train services across the West Midlands.


Arriving by bus

One Planet.**



We urge all supporters to consider available public transport when traveling to fixtures at Molineux. With a range of options available, and with Molineux being located a short distance from various transport hubs, it's now easier than ever to consider a sustainable choice.


- Last season the club introduced new recycling bins around the concourses inside the ground. The club is proud of its waste management policy that ensures zero waste is sent to landfill.

Throughout the concourses, you will find two different bins at each location: one is for General Waste, the other for Dry Mixed Recycling.

- The club work closely with local travel providers across the county to provide various offers on public transport over the season. Any offers will be shared via email to applicable supporters, so we do recommend opting in to email communication from the club.
- One home fixture per season will be dedicated to One Pack One Planet. Where the club will host various events around the topic of sustainability in football, and provide various offers such as discount on Vegan / Vegetarian food.
- The club will also survey supporters attending home games throughout the season to understand their travel habits with this providing some key data and insight into how the club can assist supporters to make more sustainable choices.

- Drinks served in the various concourses around the ground are poured into reusable cups marked 'One Planet, One Chance'. This helps the club reduce unnecessary plastic waste used on a matchday and contributes to Wolves' focus on reducing our carbon footprint.

Wolves has a dedicated Disability Access Officer (DAO) who can help you find suitable seating for short term or long term access needs.

Support is available for both seasonal and match by match tickets (subject to availability).

The DAO is on site at every home match for support.



Arriving at Molineux & Exploring the Stadium



Fan Zone

- Located next to the Sir Jack Hayward Stand (turnstile block 5).
- Entertainment, guest appearances, food and drink.
- Card payments only.



Megastore

- Located at the Stan Cullis Stand.
- Fully accessible.
- Open until half-time and again after full-time.
- Check the Wolves website for exact opening times.



Ticket Office

- Between the Stan Cullis and Billy Wright Stands.
- Open until half-time and may reopen after the match.
- Check the website for timings.



North Bank Bar

- For season ticket holders and members.
- Opens around 2 hours before kick-off and for 1 hour after the match.
- Entry is subject to capacity.



Century Accessible Lounge

- Located in the Stan Cullis Stand concourse.
- A dedicated accessible space supported by the Premier League Fans Fund.
- Provides a calm, comfortable environment for disabled supporters.



ATMs

- The stadium is cashless, but an ATM is available at Asda, a 1 minute walk from the Stan Cullis Stand.



Matchday Programme

- Sold at various points outside the stadium.



Food & Drink

- Available around the stadium and inside the concourses.
- Card payments only.



Car Parking

Make your matchday more enjoyable with hassle free parking available at various locations around Molineux. See page 4 for details



Accessible Toilets

- Accessible toilets are available throughout all concourses.
- They use RADAR key access.
- If you don't have a RADAR key, speak to a steward or contact the club before the match.



Changing Places Facility

- Located between the Steve Bull Stand and Stan Cullis Stand.
- Includes specialist equipment and extra space.



Food & Drink Accessibility

- Lowered counters are available at selected kiosks.
- Large print or easy read menus are provided where possible.



Audio Description Commentary (ADC)

- Available at all home fixtures.
- Book through our online form here



Hearing Loops

- Installed in key areas including:
 - Main reception
 - Ticket office
 - Selected matchday facilities
- Supporters needing **BSL assistance** should contact the club in advance.



Sensory Room

- A quieter space for supporters who may find the stadium environment overwhelming.

Where To Sit


Molineux has a total of 140 spaces for wheelchair users within the stadium.

Home supporters have 125 wheelchair spaces available to them. Spaces are in the Billy Wright Stand (58 spaces), Stan Cullis Stand (63 spaces), Steve Bull stand (14 spaces) and Sir Jack Hayward Stand (7 spaces). Visiting clubs have 14 spaces which are located in the lower Steve Bull stand which is pitch side. On occasions, away supporters maybe located in the Stan Cullis stand (NL6, NU6, NU7), there will be 8 wheelchair bays available in this situation.


Pitch side wheelchair user positions have little cover – blankets are available during inclement weather subject to availability. Supporters are advised to come dressed appropriately for the weather and to check the forecast before travel.

Elevated positions in the Stan Cullis stands are accessible by lifts.

Companions can sit adjacent to the wheelchair user but for busy games there are personal assistant seats behind the wheelchair user.



Support on Matchday


The **Disability Access Officer** is present at every home match.

Disabled Liaison Stewards are available before, during, and after the game.

They can help with:

- Wayfinding
- Ticket scanning
- Locating accessible toilets and counters
- Providing ear defenders or audio commentary units (subject to availability)

Leaving Molineux




Wheelchair users have dedicated accessible exits to leave the ground. All exits have flat or ramped access. If located in the upper tier, the lift can transport wheelchair users to the lower concourse to exit the ground.

The City Centre is sign posted. It is approximately a 15 minute walk to the train station.

Please be aware, exit routes to the City and external car parks are generally up hill and manual wheelchair users may need extra assistance in reaching these points.


Wolves car parks affected by steep gradients are Upper Jack Hayward Car Park and Whitmore Hill upper and lower.

External car parks affected by steep gradients are St Peter and St Paul, Birch Street, Faulkland Street and Civic Centre.

I can ask for extra help, such as audio commentary, or ear defenders.


I can eat snacks and drink water during the game.

It is okay to feel nervous or excited.




Visiting Molineux is fun and safe.
