Before that though, we're fully focussed on today's game. Coming off the back of last Sunday's tricky tie against a talented young Derby side, I know Leanne's Feds side will also pose us some problems. We've been working hard this week and want to keep our excellent run going in all competitions.



BETH MERRICK

FIRST THING

If it's a home game, I wake up about 8am and I've been having some porridge at the minute. I tend to stick with the breakfast that I've had, as long as I've played well. If I've not played well, it goes in the bin and we'll find something else, so I've never really stuck to something because I don't always play well! A couple of months ago, I started having porridge first and then having something when I got to Telford, and then we played against Halifax a few weeks ago, and I was really poor, so the porridge is gone now and I'll have to find something different.

ON THE HEADPHONES

I don't think the girls particularly like mine. I'm quite old school, so I will always have general music on up until we get to the point of getting about 10 minutes away from Telford, then I'll have a couple of songs that don't necessarily mean a lot to me, but I will belt out in the car. At the minute, I've got 'That's the way it is' by Celine Dion and then 'Suspicious Minds' by Elvis. I'm sure they wouldn't be a crowd pleaser for most because one, they're polar opposite, but two, probably not two songs that people would like, but I love them.

THE SAME ROUTINE

I am quite a superstitious person. I will always go out last in the changing room, and that's one thing I do every single game. You'll never see me at the front. I remember one time at a former club when I had the captain's armband and that's killed me, having to come first. If I've had a really good game, and they're not in a really poor state, then I won't clean my boots, because I feel like what's been produced then, they'll be able to produce the same next week. But it's the same with what I wear in terms of my sports bra and my socks. If those are the grip socks and that's the bra that I've worn in terms of having a good game, then I have to wear them the following week – obviously washed between games!

TALKING A GOOD GAME

Me and Morph will sometimes go through set pieces and things like that. When we were on the way down to Sudbury a few weeks ago on the coach, we were going through a few of the set pieces, but she's quite a wise head. I also chat a lot with Amber [Hughes] and Charlotte Greengrass, where we'll just put the world to rights. We probably won't talk too much about the game, but we'll just have a bit of a laugh and a bit of a chill. I try not to think too seriously before a game otherwise I'll end up quite nervous.

BUS BUDDIES

On the bus to away games, we sit in a very similar seat as we do at home in Telford, so it's usually me, Morph, Jade [Cross], Robbo [Beth Roberts]. I know exactly who other people will be sat next to, because we all just have those people that we're comfortable with. But we also try and keep a barrier between us and the staff, because the staff like to do their own thing, and they're quite loud – equally the same as some of our girls are, depending on what the time is. There are some people that don't really wake up until a few hours in, so you're better off leaving them alone. The younger girls, in particular, can't really hack early leave times at the minute!

AT THE GROUND

We'll sometimes go and have a look at the pitch, and me and Char [Greengrass] both have a piece of tape that we put on our finger, and we always make sure that we've done that. For me, it means a lot in terms of people that are close to me and those around me. It's one of those things that I'm sure at some point it will go out the window, because I'll try and find some other excuse as to why I played poorly!

GAME MODE

I just try and keep my mind as clear as possible. I'm quite a head player, so at times, if I overthink things, I'll go into the game like that. I've been with Macca for a long time now, and even Lee and the same with Nath, all the staff are brilliant at understanding what I need and they tend to leave me a little bit more to it. If we finish our warm-up with shooting, I'll always make sure that I finish on a goal before I go into something else. But for me, if I could turn up, not do a warm-up, and then play and get into it, I'd much rather do that because I can't stand a warm-up. I think it's such a waste of time, and I'm saying that as a 30-year-old who probably needs it.

POST-MATCH PLANS

My family will always be there, so I'll always make sure I've spoken to my dad and I'll know by his face as to whether he's thought I've done well or not. Once we've done that, there's five or six of us who will put the world to rights in the shower. Also this season, we've tried to do a little bit more to celebrate a win, so we've got this thing at the minute where we dance with socks in the changing room and spin them around. In the past I think we got caught up with winning just becoming a normal thing, but we need to try and celebrate because it doesn't happen all the time. I can't eat after a game, so wherever we are, we're always provided post-match food, but I won't have any. The other weekend, there wasn't anything provided, so Macca went and got us all Domino's, but I didn't actually eat any of it. My treat on a Sunday is just a can of coke. I adore it.

SWITCHING OFF

Wolves sometimes seems like a full-time job in itself, because I can't switch off from football. There's a lot of us that are very similar who will be messaging each other, and we'll be discussing things and airing things out after they've happened. Even when I go into school on a Monday, all my staff are brilliant in terms of asking me how it went, and they'll have seen the result or watched the game. But it's also the same with the kids, because they all want to know what's happened, and they've been really hyped over the last couple of weeks, because I did a few TikTok videos for the Adobe FA Cup account, which I didn't realise at the time would have been so big, but the kids have absolutely loved it. Football's my life, so there's no switching off from it.

Liverpool Feds

Formed in 1990, Liverpool Feds Women originated from the Liverpool Institute of Higher Education, now known as Liverpool Hope University. The Feds moniker originates from the Liverpool Institute of Higher Education College where the sports teams played as a Federation of the St Katherine's and Christ Notre Dame Colleges.

They commenced competitive football in the North West Women's Regional League and made steady progress. With player numbers increasing they added a reserve team in 1993 which was swiftly followed by a youth section which played in the Liverpool County FA Girls' League. Natural progression saw a development squad and Under-18s born as the overall club evolved. The youth section these days gives an opportunity to over 150 girls each week to learn and play football.

Having stabilised themselves in their early years they progressed through to the Premier Division of the North West Regional League in the late 1990s and went on to challenge at the top of the league in the early 2020s. Over a five season period they regularly finished in the top four but were never able to capture the title. That all changed in 2008/09 when they remained unbeaten throughout the entire campaign, drawing only three games. That title success saw them promoted to the Northern Women's Combination, the fourth tier of the women's game.

It took them a while to adapt to the higher league level as they hovered around the lower half of the table for the five seasons they were in the Northern Combination. The summer of 2014 saw a reorganisation of the women's pyramid with the Combination leagues joining the FA Women's Premier League, a change which saw Feds move into League Division One North. That season was their best at this level as they finished as runners-up.

In 2019 they captured the Liverpool County Cup for the second time before Covid struck and wiped out football for the best part of two years. In 2021/22 Leanne Duffy's side pipped Newcastle to the Division One North title, a win which raised them to their highest spot in the pyramid. To match that triumph they captured the County Cup again and made it through to the semi-finals of the FA Women's Premier League Cup where they lost narrowly to Huddersfield Town.

A solid first season in Tier 3 was followed by an improved eighth place finish in the 2023/24 season. This term they have moved to a new home at Walton Hall Park and currently sit eighth in the table.

As a self-funded, female only club ranging from Under-6s to walking football, the Feds continue to defy the odds.


