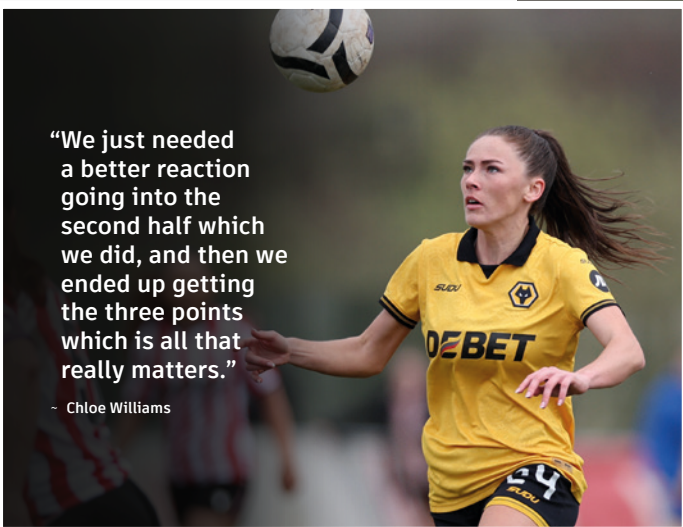

# BECKY ANDERSON

## FIRST THING

Usually, I will get up, have a shower, and try to wake myself up and get refreshed. I always have to do that on the morning of a matchday, and then if I've got time, depending on how early we have to leave, I'll try and go out for just a little walk and some fresh air, maybe a little bit of stretching. It just helps to wake my body up, clear my head, get as relaxed as possible and take my mind off football.

## FOOD AND DRINK

If I'm eating at home before an away game, I'll usually have porridge and fruit, and probably a banana, then for a home game, I probably won't have porridge, but I'll have eggs on toast once I get to the stadium for pre-match. I don't like to eat like loads before a game, because I feel heavy and slow. I've always had the same sort of thing, although I've probably become less stringent about it as I've got older, such as alternating between eggs or porridge, or whatever I fancy, rather than thinking I have to eat a certain thing.

## TALKING A GOOD GAME

At home, we probably don't really speak too much about the match. Normally, we're just talking about general things and then we'll speak about football nearer to the time we get to the ground.

## ON THE HEADPHONES

Normally I go in with Char [Greengrass], Linno [Harkin] and Simsy [Amy Sims], and Char is normally the one on the music. We'll try to be playing music with a positive energy, so nothing too slow or sad. It's got to be good vibes, so sometimes it's 80s, or it might be more modern. We also listen to Heart and like to play a game where we try to guess what the next song will be that they'll play. Everyone has to choose a song and if one of them comes on, it goes a bit mad in the car. But Simsy is really good at it, to be honest, and normally wins. We have quite similar music tastes so there's no complaints.

## BUS BUDDIES

We all have our little groups, but everyone also blends together. The younger members of the team will often have a bit of a dance and a sing song, they're normally at the back of the bus, and then the quieter members of the team tend to accumulate further to the front, but the younger ones are providing the entertainment most of the time.

## AT THE GROUND

I'm quite a tidy person, so I like to have everything in its place, so as soon as I get to the ground I'll make sure my station has everything in place all neat. Not in any particular order but just make sure it's neat and tidy. I'm also not a superstitious person, so I haven't got to have one boot here and one boot there, but I like things to just be tidy. I think it's mostly a mental thing and helps me being in a calmer environment.

## GAME MODE

When we come back in from the warm-up, we'll have the team playlist on, the music will be on, and I like to just check set pieces and what might occur during the game. I just try to stay relatively calm and not overthink too much but just focus on a few key points that we've talked about across the week, remind myself about them, and just get ready to go out and play.

## POST-MATCH PLANS

If we've won, we probably tend to put the music on and have another sing song to celebrate the win. Everyone gets involved, there's a lot of socks flying around the changing rooms, and we'll probably hang about and socialise for a little bit after the game and just have a good time. Obviously, it's a bit different if we lose.

## SWITCHING OFF

It's really easy for me to switch off after a game that we've won because I just love coming home and relaxing. I'll probably put something on the TV, catch up on the day's football, or put a movie on or a TV series. If we lose, it does become harder because you almost feel like you don't deserve to relax. A loss will always linger with you until you train again. As soon as we get back in for analysis on a Tuesday, then you have to just park it, because it's done and you can't do anything about it at that point. You have to move on and prepare for the next game. The best thing is having another game soon after, so it doesn't linger as long, and you have something else to focus on.

As part of One Pack Week, Wolves are proud to be strengthening their commitment to inclusion by joining the Hidden Disabilities Sunflower, helping to ensure that supporters with hidden disabilities feel recognised, supported and welcome at Molineux and the SEAH Stadium on matchdays and beyond.

Non-visible disabilities can include a wide range of conditions such as autism, chronic pain, hearing loss, anxiety, or neurological conditions - many of which may not be immediately visible. The Sunflower lanyard and other wearable items provide a simple but powerful way for individuals to discreetly indicate that they may need additional support, understanding, or time.

As part of this membership, Wolves have been rolling out dedicated training for staff across the club. These sessions are designed to build awareness and confidence, helping colleagues to better understand what non-visible disabilities are and how they may affect a fan's experience. Importantly, the training focuses on practical, everyday interactions - equipping staff with the tools to respond with empathy, patience, and respect.

On matchdays and event days, this training plays a vital role. From turnstiles and concourses to retail and hospitality areas, staff are encouraged to be observant and approachable, recognising the Sunflower and understanding what it represents.

Whether it's offering clearer directions, allowing extra time at entry points, or simply providing reassurance in busy or overwhelming environments, small actions can make a big difference.

The initiative also reflects Wolves' wider commitment to creating an inclusive environment for everyone, not just supporters, but staff and the wider community too. By embedding this awareness across the organisation, the club is helping to foster a culture where people feel seen, understood, and supported.

This membership is another step forward in ensuring that matchdays are accessible and enjoyable for all. Wolves encourage fans who feel they would benefit from additional support to make use of the Sunflower lanyard, and for all visitors to be mindful and respectful of those around them.

## Halifax FC Women

Halifax FC Women were formed in 2013 as Brighthouse Town Ladies. Current manager Rob Mitchell helped to set the club up and guided them from the sixth to the third tier where they play in the FA Women's National League Northern Premier Division.

In their first season 'Town' managed to complete an unbeaten campaign, winning the NERWFL Southern Division. This was followed by a runners-up spot behind Hull City in the NERWFL Premier Division alongside lifting the League Cup.

The team went one better the following season, taking the title after another unbeaten season. They also reached the final of the West Riding County Cup, eventually losing out to then tier three side Bradford City.

FA Cup runs to the third and fourth rounds followed with glamour ties against WSL sides Sunderland and Everton, giving the club a taste of what could be with them now competing in the FA Women's National League

Northern Division One alongside the likes of Newcastle United, Leeds United and Burnley.

The next two seasons saw consecutive second place finishes to Hull City and then Burnley which saw the club establish themselves as one of the stronger teams in the league.

Following the COVID pandemic the FA announced that promotion would be awarded to clubs which could submit a long-term development plan as well as other criteria relating to sporting merit. The club was successful and was awarded promotion enabling them to compete in the FA Women's National League Northern Premier Division for the first time in their history.

Two County Cup wins in successive seasons as well as a very respectable seventh place finish were followed up by a fifth place finish the following season.

In the summer of 2023, the club rebranded as Halifax FC Women and became

completely independent and self-funded. A strong second half of the 2023/24 season saw wins against Wolves and Nottingham Forest and a point against Champions Newcastle United helping the club finish in a respectable sixth place. They rounded off the season by winning another County Cup with victory over Leeds Mods.

The 2024/25 season finished with another County Cup Final, this time losing on penalties to Leeds United. In the league they finished 11th but avoided relegation due to Blackburn Rovers' issues in the Championship and their subsequent demotion.

This term they sit tenth as we head into today's final game of the season, level on points with Loughborough Lightning, so they have everything to play for in this game as they battle to avoid relegation.

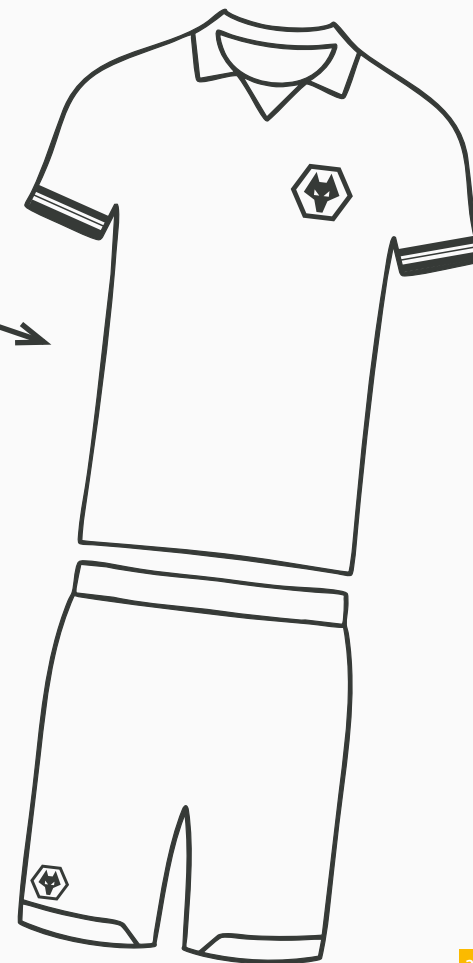

## PLAY-OFF FINAL

This season has been closely contested throughout, with Wolves going toe to toe with a fully professional Burnley side for the duration of the campaign. As we go into the final game, Wolves currently sit in second place in the table, just one point behind Burnley and with the title still up for grabs.

If Wolves win today's game and Burnley either lose or draw their home game against Stoke City, Wolves will be crowned League Champions. If Burnley win their game, Wolves will finish in second place. For this season only, there is a second opportunity for promotion as the second-placed teams in the Northern and Southern divisions will go into a play-off for the additional promotion place to WSL 2, made available by the expansion of the football pyramid.

Plymouth Argyle have already secured second place in the Southern Division and will be Wolves' opponents should Burnley win the Northern Division title.

The play-off will be held on Bank Holiday Monday 4th May at the Pirelli Stadium in Burton Upon Trent with a 1pm kick-off. Tickets will go on sale in due course, with the ticket link to be shared on FA Women's National League social channels. Tickets will be available to buy for just £10 for adults and £5 for concessions, with additional fan activations taking place around the fixture to ensure a brilliant day out for supporters.

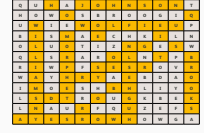
