Supporters travelling to Dublin are reminded that they will be ambassadors for the club and the city of Wolverhampton and are asked to ensure they represent both in a positive manner at all times.

After the club's recent punishment from the Football Association in relation to homophobic chanting by some Wolves supporters during our match against Chelsea in April, it is pertinent to remind supporters that the club operate a zero-tolerance approach to all forms of discrimination, harassment and victimisation relating to sex, gender, sexual orientation as well as religion or race and disability.

Wolves urges supporters to show respect and not chant songs that could be regarded as insulting to others, particularly from a religious or political perspective. All unacceptable behaviour will be dealt with in line with our acceptable behaviour policy which can be viewed [here](#).

Tickets

Tickets for this fixture are sold directly through Ticketmaster. No tickets are available directly through the club for this fixture.

Tickets will also be available to purchase on the day at the stadium. TBC

Tickets will be delivered as e-tickets, and you will have the option to have these delivered as mobile tickets or print at home tickets at the checkout stage.

Supporters are advised to have their tickets downloaded / pre-loaded on your device prior to reaching the ground.

Turnstiles open from 12.30pm, and supporters are recommended to arrive as early as possible to alleviate any queueing.

Any supporters who experience any issues relating to their tickets are advised to speak to a steward at the ground, who will be able to assist further.

There is also a Ticketmaster and FAI matchday helpdesk on site.



Getting there

Due to several large events happening in the city at the same time, supporters are recommended to plan and book travel in advance when possible.

Flight

There are regularly scheduled flights leaving Birmingham Airport, arriving at Dublin Airport. Both Ryanair and Aer Lingus operate flights departing and returning to Birmingham Airport.

Ferry

The closest port to get the ferry to Dublin is from Holyhead. Both Irish Ferries and Stena Line operate ferries departing and returning to Holyhead. Holyhead is around 2 hours 50 minutes from Wolverhampton via car or coach.

Dublin Airport to Dublin City Centre

Taxis and coaches are available from the airport and can be pre-booked through various companies.

Dublin City Centre to Aviva Stadium

The Aviva Stadium is around a 30-minute walk from the centre of Dublin. Supporters are advised not to use local trains, due to numerous large events happening in the city. Buses and taxis are available from around the city centre.

Capacity: 51,700
Address: Aviva Stadium, Lansdowne Road, Dublin, Ireland

The Aviva Stadium is built on the site of the former Lansdowne Road Stadium, which was demolished in 2007, and replaced it as home to its chief tenants: the Irish rugby union team and the Republic of Ireland football team

There are numerous bars and restaurants in the vicinity of the stadium available for all supporters.

Prohibited Items

Fireworks, smoke canisters, vuvuzelas, bottles, knives, glasses, cans, flag poles, banners, laser devices, dangerous or hazardous items and other similar articles or containers including anything which could or might be used as a weapon are not permitted within the ground and any person in possession of such an article or container may be refused entry or ejected from the Stadium. Umbrellas are not permitted to be used within Aviva Stadium. Prams/ Strollers are not permitted within Aviva Stadium.

Bag Policy

No bags (with the exception of small handbags) will be allowed into the stadium. Handbags will be subject to search.

Flags and Banners

Flag poles or banners are not prohibited inside the stadium.
Any flags with political or offensive material is strictly prohibited and will be ejected from the stadium.

Here are some of the top rated tourist attractions to see and do whilst in Dublin.

The Guinness Storehouse

St. James's Gate, D08 VF8H

Brewery experience telling the tale of Ireland's famous beer, with tastings and a rooftop bar.

Temple Bar

Dublin 2, D02 N725

A busy riverside neighbourhood, spread over cobbled pedestrian lanes. Crowded pubs host live folk music and DJ sets, and diners pack restaurants serving Asian, American and Irish cuisine. Quirky boutiques stock clothes and crafts by local designers.

Kilmainham Gaol Museum

Inchicore Rd, Kilmainham, Dublin 8, D08 RK28

A former prison in Kilmainham, Dublin, Ireland. It is now a museum run by the Office of Public Works, an agency of the Government of Ireland.

Jameson Distillery Bow St.

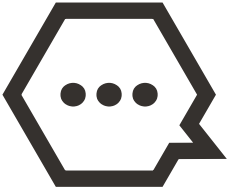
Bow St, Smithfield, Dublin 7, D07 N9VH
