Good afternoon and welcome to the SEAH Stadium for this afternoon's visit of Middlesbrough.

It is nice to be back on home soil for the fourth time in five games, although of course last weekend took a different turn when the torrential rain prompted a change in venue to the Compton training ground.

It was really important that we managed to get the game on, and for that we must thank groundsman Wayne Lumbard and his team for allowing us to switch to Compton. I would like to take this opportunity to apologise to fans who were unable to watch the game, which is far from ideal, as we massively enjoy and value your support. We just decided it was necessary to make sure we played to avoid any fixture backlogs over future weeks.

It took a while for the girls to settle after the change in venue and delayed kick off, and the young Manchester United PGA team proved excellent opposition, but we came through to record the win which takes us to the brink of qualification for the next stage of the League Cup.

It has been a very busy start to the season, and the strength of our squad means we have been able to rotate the team to keep everyone fresh, including giving opportunities to several young players last weekend.

Amelia Hiscox managed to grab a late goal to seal the win, and I was delighted to be able to give a debut to Sareet Binning, at 16 years and five days one of the youngest ever to have played for the club.

As I said after the match, I remember meeting an eight-year-old Sareet not long after I took the job here at Wolves, and she told me she was going to play for the first team one day. Well, that day has arrived, and she has earned her place on merit for the talent and hard work she has shown in abundance over these last eight years.

Sareet is balancing still being at school and working closely with us at Wolves by picking up experience at an elite youth level with Leicester's PGA squad, another great example of how we can tailor our approach here to the benefit both of individual players and the squad as a whole.

Today we welcome Michael Mulhern and his Middlesbrough side who secured promotion last season after losing just one game in the league, and have kept three successive clean sheets.

We will have to produce another good performance to continue our great start to the campaign – and that is what we will be aiming to do.

# SAREET BINNING

## History was made at the Compton training ground last weekend.

At just 16 years and five days old, and entering the pitch as a 65th minute substitute for Wolves Women against Manchester United Professional Game Academy (PGA), Sareet Binning became one of the youngest players to have ever represented the team.

She is also the first Sikh to have played for Wolves.

"It was fantastic and I am really grateful to have been given this opportunity," said Binning.

"Macca (manager Dan McNamara) and the coaching staff have put in so much work and had so much belief in me to help me progress to get to this moment.

"And the girls, my team-mates, have been amazing, ever since I moved up from the academy to the first team.

"They have really taken me under their wing which has helped me ease into the set-up."

Moments and achievements like this in football are often about so much more than the individual player.

It's a significant and richly deserved milestone for Binning, testament to the skill and enthusiasm of the Wolves management and coaching staff, but also to the dedication and sacrifices made by her family.

The game being played behind closed doors after the stormy weather led to AFC Telford's SEAH Stadium becoming unplayable, certainly couldn't take any of the gloss away from Binning's big first-team breakthrough.

"It was a big occasion for us on Sunday and we are extremely proud," says Dad, Pin.

"Not just because it was Sareet's senior debut, but because it was a senior debut for Wolves.

"She has been there for such a long time that we feel really attached to the club, especially with how Macca and all the coaches have looked after her from day one.

"It has been amazing over the years and we were all very proud on Sunday."

It was a debut that was perhaps written in the stars, from the moment Binning first caught the attention of Wolves scouts whilst turning out at grass roots level.

Too young at seven to be considered for the girls' under-10 team, she spent a year-and-a-half at the boys' development centre before coming through another trial and joining the girls' set-up at Wolves at eight-and-a-half.

It was not long into McNamara's tenure as manager of Wolves Women, and, speaking after last Sunday's game, which finished in a 3-1 victory, he was able to recall the impact a young Binning made back in those early days.

"Eight years ago, I remember an eight-year-old Sareet Binning telling me she was going to play for Wolves Women and I never dreamt that I would still be here to give her that debut," he reflects.



"It's not just about putting these players on the pitch and giving them their moment, it's about seeing whether they can compete at that level or not.

"I think she'll go down as one of the youngest ever players to represent the club at 16 and five days old, but I thought she was excellent.

"She earned her place on the pitch on Sunday and I am proud to have played a part in her journey."

McNamara and his staff, along with those who worked within the Wolves' Regional Talent Centre (RTC), have played pivotal roles in the development of Binning from that young and ambitious eight-year-old to a teenage star who has already realised some of those ambitions.

A versatile central midfielder who is so effective both in and out of possession, her progress was quickened by regularly being tested a year or two above her age group.

"When I was 11, I was pushed up to the Under-14s, and from there I have played up at least a year all the way through," Binning explains.

"That has helped me so much, both in challenging me physically and making me stronger, but also in helping me move the ball quicker and become sharper as a result."

"When training and playing with older players, Sareet would set herself a target that within three to six months she would be comfortable in that situation," adds Pin.

"She has been training with the women's team for a while now, and I have to give so much credit to Macca and Wolves for the environment which they have created.

"We have been here pretty much since he arrived, and have seen how every season there has been progression.

"The environment is brilliant, and gives the players every opportunity to develop as much as they can."

The development of Binning has taken her not just into the senior picture at Wolves, but also onto the international scene with different England junior teams.

For the last couple of years she has been around the England set-up, having initially come through a lengthy recruitment process of a major training camp followed by a series of talent identification events, a long list selection and then finally making it into the team.

She made her debut at Under-15 level against the Netherlands, appeared at the prestigious Montaigu tournament earlier this summer including captaining the Under-16s against hosts France.



Her first game with the armband, against Switzerland towards the end of last year, remains her favourite, as she scored two superb goals and was named Player of the Match.



She has come a long way from the time, many years ago, when she recalls meeting, and being inspired by, former Wolves midfielder Tammy George.

Now, and including having become the first Sikh to captain an England team at any level, she is in the process of becoming a role model herself.

"There probably weren't many role models for young girls when I was growing up but with the

way the game has developed, I want to be the best role model that I can be," she explains.

"I really want to help young girls to see that they too can achieve whatever they want, as long as they work hard and believe in themselves.

"I'd love to become a role model to encourage girls to take up football, not just for fun but also because there is the potential to build a career. It can be done."

Aside from trying to pick up as many minutes as possible for Wolves' first team this season, and contribute to what is expected to be a strong push for promotion, Binning has dual registration with Leicester City which will offer opportunities to enjoy elite competition in the Under-21 PGA League.

That offers plenty of balance to her football moving forward, along with the importance of her studies at the Royal School, and taking time to spend with family and, 'be a kid' as well.

And therein lies the maturity and attitude which has served Binning in such good stead so far, and will undoubtedly do so in the years to come.

She harbours big ambitions. Playing in the WSL (Women's Super League) within the next few years, and breaking into the senior ranks for the Lionesses.



But it's most definitely about 'taking small steps'. One milestone at a time. Ask the question of how she has managed to continue to progress and overcome obstacles during her fledgling career to date, and the answer is clear.

"I just try and take it all in and enjoy every single moment," she admits.

"It's a love of the game that drives me so much, and I am just so happy when I play football.

"It brings a smile to my face every time I go out onto the pitch, and I just want to push myself to be ambitious and become the best player and person that I can be.

**"I think when you are happy and really enjoying it, that gives you the best chance to exceed expectations."**

Sareet Binning. Making history and breaking down barriers, with desire and determination, but a smile on her face. Just as it should be.



## Middlesbrough FC Women

Formed in 1976, the club was originally known as Cleveland Spartans and played in the Nottinghamshire Ladies League.

Coached by Middlesbrough players Mark Proctor and David Hodgson, they reached the 1982 FA Cup Final, losing 2–0 to Lowestoft Town before joining the Yorkshire and Humberside Ladies League.

In 1996 Marrie Wieczorek became full-time manager and the Teessiders won the 2001/02 Northern Combination under her guidance, meaning they were promoted to the FA Women's Premier League Northern Division.

An interesting moment in their history came in 2010, when they travelled to North Korea to play two friendly matches.

Ben Fisher became Chairman in 2020 and Wieczorek returned to the club as an ambassador. That season Middlesbrough reached the semi-finals of the 2019/20 FA National League Plate.

Former Middlesbrough player Andy Campbell was appointed manager in August 2021, overseeing a relegation to the fourth tier in his first season.

A landmark moment came in May 2023, as the club officially became re-affiliated with the men's team and current manager Michael Mulhern took the reins.


It didn't take long for the team to play at the Riverside Stadium for the first time, welcoming Stockport County for a 0-0 draw in September 2023.

Their first win at the Riverside came against Doncaster Rovers Belles in March 2024, with Ellen Turnbull scoring their first ever goal there en route to a 5-0 victory.

Last season was a successful one for Mulhern and his players as they won the FA WNL Division One North on goal difference. A 3-0 victory over Barnsley at Oakwell on the final day was enough to see them over the line ahead of Cheadle Town Stingers, who also earned 51 points.

After three years away, Boro are enjoying their return to tier three football and are keen to solidify their position in the next nine months.

**Wolves' 3-1 victory against Manchester United PGA last weekend made it two wins from two in the FA WNL Cup, enough to take a big step closer to the next phase of the competition.**

This season's FA WNL Cup is utilising a format similar to the old Champions League with mini leagues followed by a knockout phase.

Unlike the better-known competition, teams will only play each other once in each mini league.

Once again, the Professional Game Academy teams will be taking part. Last season they featured in the Plate competition but this time they will enter at the group stage.




